**Proper for Today's Mass**: The texts proper to today's Mass begin on page 51 in the *St. Edmund Campion Missal & Hymnal*.

**Blessed Epiphany Chalk:** Chalk blessed today is available in the vestibule, along with instructions on its use in marking a house. (Those who will receive the Epiphany House Blessing may wait for the priest to mark their houses.)

**Epiphany House Blessing**: In the Church's traditional liturgical books, there is a "Blessing for a House on the Feast of the Epiphany." The ceremony consists in the recitation of an antiphon for the Epiphany, followed by Our Lady's *Magnificat*, during which the house is sprinkled with special, Epiphany Holy Water and is incensed, followed by a prayer and blessing by the priest. Fathers McCambridge and Braun will divide the visits between themselves, between January 6<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>.

**Second Sunday Brunch, January 13**, is our annual Chili Cook-off. Bring your favorite chili recipe. Voting by ballot to determine which entry is the winner! We also need crackers, cheese, sour cream, and whatever else you like with your chili.

Display of Sacred Relics: Several parishes will host Fr. Carlos Martins (of the Companions of the Cross), for display a Vatican collection of more than 150 relics, some as old as 2,000 years. Among them will be relics of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Faustina Kowalska. There will also be present a portion of Our Lady's veil, as well as one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. The faithful will be able to examine and venerate each relic. In the Church's history, many miracles and healings have been worked in the presence of relics, and many have been healed through this ministry. Please do not miss this opportunity. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members, which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession.
