



## Parents enlist youth for ministries

Through Discípulos de Cristo program, St. Willebrord families put faith into action

**GREEN BAY** — Juanita Fiscal and her husband, Julio Zúñiga, enrolled in the Discípulos de Cristo lay formation program, sponsored by the Diocese of Green Bay, three years ago. As members of St. Willebrord Parish, they wanted to learn more about their faith.

"We were lacking so much knowledge about our Catholic faith, especially about the Mass," Fiscal said in an interview with The Compass. "We are here almost every Sunday, and not knowing exactly what was happening or the meaning of certain things — that was embarrassing."

Juanita said the program not only taught them all about the Mass, it inspired them to start a youth program with other parents at St. Willebrord, "Amigos de Jesus" (Friends of Jesus), to help children learn about the Mass and participate in liturgical roles.

As part of the Discípulos de Cristo program, participants are asked to return to their parishes and find a way to put their faith into practice. "We noticed that we needed some type of program that would

bring those kids who made their first Communion" back to church by getting them involved in Sunday liturgies, said Fiscal.

"Another person said, 'What if we also teach those kids the sequence of the Mass, like everything that happens during the Mass?" she noted. While this is covered in religious education classes, they wanted to go more in-depth, Fiscal said.

Norbertine Fr. Andrew Cribben, pastor of St. Willebrord Parish, said he is delighted to have the parents take an active role in preparing their children for Mass and getting them involved in the lituray.


"Juanita and her collaborators from Discípulos de Cristo ... wanted to use their growing knowledge of the sacraments, theology and their spirituality

for the good of others," he said.
"They had heard my desire, as
pastor, that the children might
be more attentive and participative at the Eucharist. The group

prepares the children first to know and appreciate the Eucharist, and then to know and fulfill the ministries of reader, usher, greeter, singer and member of the assembly."

## Human trafficking a local problem: Oshkosh parishes host presentation

OSHKOSH — Horrific stories about human trafficking and children forced into prostitution often bring to mind desperate situations in countries such as Cambodia or India. And while help in foreign regions is urgently needed, perhaps even more disturbing is that situations just as horrifying are happening every day in the United States and northeastern Wisconsin.

That was the message of Lisa Sennholz,

founder and director of the support organization Damascus Road, and Elizabeth, a former victim, who spoke May 17 at St. Raphael the Archangel Church. The event was sponsored in collaboration with all of the Oshkosh parishes.

It is estimated that 30 million people are being held and abused against their will around the world today, Sennholz said. Two hundred of those victims are thought to be right here in Wisconsin.

"The United States is the second-largest receiving country (of abducted women and

girls for the sex trade) in the world and we are second only because the countries in Europe are counted as one whole," Sennholz said.

"There are more strip clubs in Wisconsin than in the state of Nevada," where brothels are legal in some areas, she said. "Even though you don't see human trafficking with your own eyes, it's happening right here in Oshkosh through online exploitation, hotels and motels, strip clubs and families," she said.

# 5 THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

#### About the feast of Corpus Christi

- The Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is perhaps better known as Corpus Christi, Latin for "The Body of Christ." This year the feast is June 4.
- 2 Corpus Christi traditionally falls 60 days after Easter. In Rome, it is always celebrated on Thursday.
- The feast dates the efforts of a Norbertine nun in Belgium, St. Juliana of Liege. Through a series of visions and private revelations in prayer, the Lord inspired St. Juliana to promote a feast to celebrate the Blessed Sacrament. She faced much opposition in her homeland and died in 1252.
- The first Corpus Christi feast was celebrated in 1261. In 1264, Pope Urban IV ordered it to be celebrated by the universal church.
- 5 Several traditions surround the feast, including eucharistic processions to temporary street shrines around a town, floral street carpets (tapetes) and flower wreaths.

## Hortonville parish youth collect more than 3,200 pairs of shoes

**HORTONVILLE** — Images of Haitian children wearing crushed plastic water bottles tied to their feet with string in lieu of shoes shocked 17-year-old Alysha Werner.

"İt definitely shocked me. It seems so inhumane," said Werner, a junior at Hortonville High School and one of scores of youth from Ss. Peter and Paul Parish collecting thousands of pairs of shoes for residents of Haiti, Africa and the Philippines.

The shoe collection effort is part of the

faith formation global outreach program at Ss. Peter and Paul. Students driving the shoe collection are members of the parish, but attend Hortonville public schools.

As of May 17, students collected more than 3,200 pairs of shoes, surpassing their goal of 2,500 pairs. The collection continues through the end of the month.

"I generally don't have a lot of shoes, but I donated two pair that are getting too small for me," Werner said. The shoe collection effort has drawn interest not only from parish, but from the Hortonville community.
