

## Antigo Catholics say Philly pilgrimage was 'life changing'

ANTIGO — It started, for some, as an admittedly selfish desire to see a rock star pope, to be able to brag that "I was there" when Francis came to America.

Joining the Bradleys on the pilgrimage were fellow St. John the Evangelist parishioners Lynne and Brad Henricks and





### Coaching legend Dick Bennett tells NDA students to 'become like Christ'

GREEN BAY — Dick Bennett stood at midcourt in Notre Dame Academy's Schneider Triton Center, but the coaching legend was not there to talk basketball. While he did weave the sport into parts of his talk, Bennett's message at the Oct. 8 pep rally — featuring the Notre Dame band and pom pons — focused on faith and getting to know Jesus Christ.

"Do you recognize what a privilege you have going to school here?" Bennett asked the high

school students. "You don't have to hide your faith. That gets bigger as you get older. You can talk about it. You can worship. You can say a prayer; you can debate the issues. If you were somewhere else, you couldn't do that."

Bennett explained that, in his first season coaching at the University of Wisconsin in Madison, he was almost fired for arranging for voluntary Sunday services in the locker room. He was required to attend a seminar on separation of church and state.

"If you believe in Jesus Christ, you become

what St. Peter called 'a foreigner in the land,'" said Bennett, who also coached collegiately at UW-Stevens Point, UW-Green Bay and Washington State. "Have you ever thought of yourselves in that way?"

He added that believers should follow what Christ said about being called to be in the world, but not of the world. Living in a competitive world makes this difficult, he explained.



### What a difference a pack of diapers makes

ALLOUEZ - A woman decides to choose life and has her baby. Then what?

Her baby needs diapers, at the cost of \$30 to \$40 for a month's supply, and the rent is

"We are pro-life, so we need to be helping the women after they make life-affirming decisions," said Celia McKee, Dignity of Human Life coordinator for the Diocese of Green Bay. "So we will support them with their basic needs, such as diapers. We know there are a lot of people in poverty or close to poverty that need our help. If they can't afford the basic things, we aren't doing our calling to live the corporal works of mercy."

With that aim in mind, Catholic Charities and the Living Justice Department of the diocese are working together on their first, diocesanwide diaper drive. It began on Aug. 24 and runs through Oct. 4, Respect Life Sunday. People can drop off diapers at Catholic Charities locations in Green Bay and Appleton, as well as at several crisis pregnancy centers across northeast Wisconsin. Additionally, several parishes are holding diaper drives, including Stella Maris in northern Door County.
