We continue to honor his beliefs and are excited to be embarking on our tenth school year. Though there are many great things already happening at St. John Bosco, we know the importance of Kaizen, i.e., continuous improvement, and

Digital Transformation Plan was a continual work in progress during the summer, additional cabling was run, new hubs put in, devices ordered and programmed (iPads and laptops), smartboards installed and a developmental schedule was created to facilitate training in the use of the technology by staff and students.
