# Silent CANDLELIGHT Walk

Join us as we walk in silence carrying a candle from the Government Center (symbolizing our government's legalization of abortion in 1973) to the Hospital (a life SAVING facility in CONTRAST). We appreciate our local hospital's policy of not performing abortions.

This is not a "Protest March" (No signs please) but a **Silent Candlelight Vigil Walk**. Pray *silently* or else just walk *in silence*. Bring your own lantern or candle (in a jar as a windbreak) and line up & light candles prior to the opening prayer (Promptly at 6:30). Children are welcome. Bring a car load of friends. Dress warmly and listen to the local radio station in case of bad weather. If it's canceled, we will reschedule for the next night, Jan. 22.

There will be a closing prayer and *Refreshments* will be served in the Hospital cafeteria immediately following the walk. Rides are available to bring drivers back to their cars.

Anyone who cannot walk with us is encouraged to place a lit candle in their window the night of the walk and to join us in prayer.

## **Friday: "When You Suffer"**

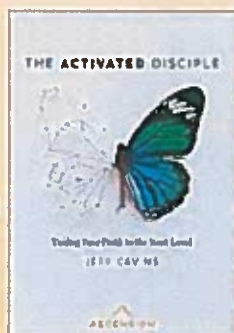

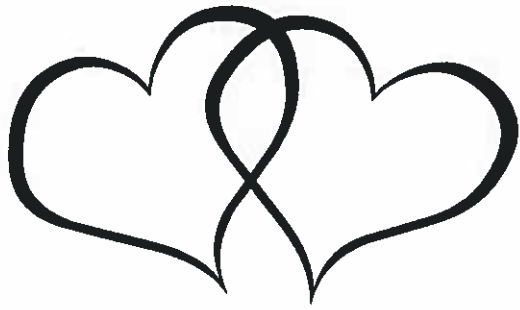
