

## After 34 years, Appleton parish to hold its final rummage sale July 29-Aug. 2

**APPLETON** — What is billed as “Northeast Wisconsin’s Largest Rummage Sale” will take place one last time July 29 to Aug. 2 at St. Bernadette Church, 2331 Lourdes Drive.

Now in its 34th consecutive year, the St. Bernadette Rummage Sale, which brings in hundreds of people over the five-day event, netted approximately \$55,000 last year. Held in the St. Bernadette Center, it fills the entire first floor and lower level, according to Sue Taylor, chair of the parish pastoral council.

“St. Bernadette has decided to discontinue the rummage sale, as we have a new lease beginning Oct. 1, 2020, with The Richardson School, which is part of MyPath Companies,” Taylor told The Compass in an email. “This will be a year-round service offered to the communities within an hour distance.”

According to its website, The Richardson School serves

children with autism spectrum disorders, intellectual disabilities, emotional/behavioral disabilities, orthopedic impairments, developmental delays, learning disabilities, traumatic brain injuries and other health impairments.

“The Richardson School approached us last October.

We then began to work with our trustees, finance council, pastoral council, building and grounds as well as talking with the rummage sale coordinators to get everyone’s input and approval,” said Taylor.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On our itinerary of catechesis on prayer, today we meet King David. ## Catholic schools in Green Bay Diocese will open in fall

**ALLOUEZ** — All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Green Bay will open this fall for in-person classes.

“We are pleased to announce that we will be ‘open for business’ in grades PK3-12 for the 2020-2021 school year,” said Todd Blahnik, diocesan superintendent of Catholic schools, in a press release dated July 2. “Our planning

has been ongoing since the pandemic hit. Our schools have been developing a strategy to address student and faculty health and safety based on recommendations from the CDC, Department of Public Instruction (DPI), Wisconsin Department of Health and Human Services and county health departments. Our schools will be sharing plans with their community in greater detail as the summer unfolds.”

Under orders from the State of Wisconsin

and DPI, students and faculty left their schools and moved to virtual education in late March, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. “While this event changed the delivery of education in the final months of the school year, Catholic school students and staff were able to pivot quickly and resume lessons in a virtual environment,” according to the diocesan press release.

**1** August has several Marian feasts. Foremost is the Solemnity of the Assumption on Aug. 15. Orthodox Christians mark the Dormition ("falling asleep") of the Virgin Mary that day.

**2** Another well-known feast is the Queenship of Mary, celebrated on Aug. 22. Both feasts are honored in the rosary's Glorious Mysteries.

**3** Lesser known, but a favorite of St. John Paul II, honors the Black Madonna of Czstochow (Aug. 26).

**4** Our Lady of the Snows (Aug. 5) recalls an appearance of Mary promising a miraculous snowfall in Rome in 352 A.D.

**5** The feast of Our Lady of Knock (Aug. 21) honors Mary's appearing in Ireland in 1879.

## Resisting the 'terror on every side'

Dear friends and followers of Jesus:

In the first reading for Sunday, June 21, we heard the lament of the prophet Jeremiah, "Terror on every side." In some ways, those words feel like an appropriate way to

describe our world right now. We are in an ongoing battle against the COVID-19 pandemic and the physical and economic toll it is taking on people's lives. We are also witnessing widespread civil unrest as people speak out against the evil of racism and the way it continues to plague our country and our world. All of this comes in the midst of great political division and social and ideological confusion. Rather

than helping to heal wounds of the past and present, we are driving ourselves further apart.

As we thank God for religious liberty during Religious Freedom Week, we must realize the great need of our nation, which has been a beacon of hope for religious liberty throughout the world. We have to help our country to heal by including God, not excluding him, by asking the Holy Spirit to illuminate our conscience, individual and communal, so God's light can shine. It could become commonplace to wake up with a feeling of "terror on every side" and

even dread, if we do not listen and act with charity towards one another. As Pope Francis recently said to the American people, "Nothing is gained by violence and so much is lost."

As followers of Jesus, we must resist the temptation to see only the darkness around us by remembering that Christ is the Light of the World. We intentionally reject the impulse to give up hope and live in fear by calling to mind the most frequent command of the Bible, "Be not afraid." We must do as Jesus taught, "Love one another as I have loved you."

This is no easy task and we are being called to commit to pray and work at mutual understanding. Thankfully, we have a strong tradition within the Catholic Church to guide us through times like these. Specifically, I call on all of us to pray, fast and give alms to promote peace in our own lives and in our world. While we tend to think of these as Lenten disciplines, the truth is throughout the history of the church, they have been practiced at all times of the year, especially in times of trial. Here are just a few practical ways that you might pray, fast and give alms for our world today.

Pray a litany to St. Joseph, for people who have lost their jobs or businesses as a result of the pandemic. The Litany to St. Joseph, available at [gbdic.org/stjoseph](http://gbdic.org/stjoseph), will be a big help in this. Offer a rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet for people who have suffered as a result of discrimination.
