



This is a temporary situation, don't let volatile feelings hurt relationships that you have cultivated for many years. Things will change and it will be hard to heal those memories of words and actions. Everyone has their own opinions and beliefs.

Where you find yourself isn't where you are always going to remain. If you are in an unwanted or pressure-filled time, it won't last forever, and God will be at work in whatever you are in to take you to a place of blessing. Don't let your current frustration define your future destination. Make a decision in the dark times to talk to God about your future and to rest secure that He has a plan. Often, we are desperate to move through unwanted times as quickly as possible. It is human nature to not want to have to struggle.
