### Confirmation Class 2022

This weekend, the bishop of our diocese, Bishop David Ricken will confirm 20 students at our neighboring parish of St. Joseph. The twenty students hail from our parish as well as the parishes of St. Peter & St. Paul, St. Joseph and Holy Name of Mary.

Needless to say, this is a very special weekend for these young people and their families as they receive the third and final Sacrament of Initiation. Confirmation, along with the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Eucharist, bring the confirmed to the "full stature of Christ" through the workings of the Holy Spirit. When these students were baptized, others spoke for them; their parents and sponsors, now at their Confirmation they will speak for themselves and proclaim their commitment to Christ. The Sacrament is received through the laying on of hands, just as we read in Holy Scripture (Act 8: 14-17) when the Apostles Peter and John laid their hands on the people of Samaria.

Bishops are the successors of the Apostles and have the power to bestow the Holy Spirit on the baptized, either personally or through the Priests they appoint. The confirmand (person being confirmed) is consecrated into the Mission of the Church by the Anointing with Holy Chrism which seals the Gift of the Holy Spirit.

We pray "Come Holy Spirit, fill their hearts with the Fire of Your Love." Congratulations to all our newly confirmed!

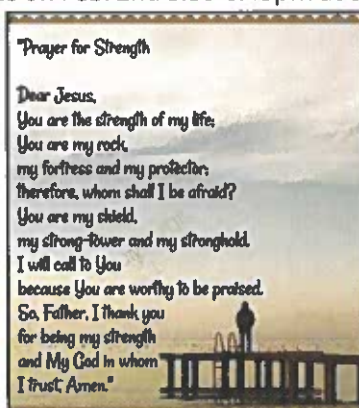

## Franciscan sisters religiously cheer on Packers

**MANITOWOC** — On the far west side of Manitowoc, atop a hill overlooking picturesque Silver Lake, sits the historic Holy Family Convent. Motherhouse to the Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity, its hallowed halls, accented with reverent artworks, are serene and hushed.

There is one room in the 19th-century building, however, where it can get quite spirited. And it was so on Sunday afternoon, Jan. 9, when the Green Bay Packers faced the Detroit Lions during the last game of the 2021 regular season.

On the second floor of the convent, the sisters gather in a spacious lounge to regularly watch their beloved Packers play. Furnished with rows of easy chairs facing a 54-inch flat-screen TV, the lounge has splashes of green and gold that contrast with the sisters' black-and-white habits.

"This is the loud group," said Sr. Barbara Mathe with a grin. In another room, just down the hall, more sisters gather to cheer on the Packers quietly, she explained.

On one wall of the lounge hangs a framed Packers jersey that reads, "Thank Heaven for 87." It is autographed by former Packers wide receiver Jordy Nelson.

A nearby Christmas tree is decorated in green and gold. Other memorabilia the sisters have accumulated over the years include a football autographed by Packers players, a cheesehead hat, caricatures of Coach Matt LaFleur and general

manager Brian Gutekunst, and an autographed photo of the late Reggie White, former Green Bay defensive end.

A core group of sisters have been Packers fans "forever," Sr. Barbara said.

Describing herself as "an avid follower," she's been a Packers fan for as long as she can remember.

### FRANKLY, FRANCIS



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The evangelists Matthew and Mark refer to Joseph as a "carpenter" or "joiner." We heard earlier that the people of Nazareth, hearing Jesus speak, asked themselves: "Is not this the carpenter's son?" (13:55; cf. Mk 6:3). Jesus practiced his father's trade.

The Greek term *tekton*, used to specify Joseph's work, has been translated in various ways. The Latin Fathers of the church rendered it as "carpenter." But let us bear in mind that in the Palestine of Jesus' time, wood was used not only to make ploughs and various pieces of furniture, but also to build houses, which had wooden frames and terraced roofs made of beams connected with branches and earth.

Therefore, "carpenter" or "joiner" was a generic qualification, indicating both woodworkers and craftsmen engaged in activities related to construction.

## Afghan refugee helps Catholic Charities welcome new arrivals

**ALLOUEZ** — Sayed Wardak, 32, spent five years as a translator for the U.S. Army in Afghanistan. In 2016, after nearly a year of hiding from the Taliban and in fear for his life, Wardak and his wife, Sairah, immigrated to the United States.

Knowing firsthand the perils of life in Afghanistan, and the challenges of resettling in a new country, Wardak now assists newly-

arrived Afghan refugees in Green Bay as an employee of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Green Bay.

Wardak said his part-time role at Catholic Charities is to serve as an interpreter. He helps refugees who speak Dari, the most widely spoken language in Afghanistan, and translates Dari into English for other Catholic Charities staff members. "I take people to the doctor, show them how to find a grocery

store, help get their driving license, find jobs and legal documentation," he told The Compass.

According to Wardak, when he arrived in the United States, he had limited help in making the transition into American society. Making that transition easier for fellow Afghans "means a lot to me," he said.

## St. Peter's Chair

- 1 The Chair of St. Peter is a real chair set high above an altar at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, beneath the alabaster Holy Spirit window.
- 2 The monument encasing the chair is made of bronze and was created by Gian Lorenzo Bernini in the early 1600s.
- 3 Inside the bronze monument is a small oak and acacia wood chair, traditionally said to be Peter's. It symbolizes the pope's role to rule, teach and govern.
- 4 This chair was once used by all popes to sit upon when they were installed. That practice ended in the 14th century.
- 5 On Feb. 22, candles illuminate the chair through pinholes in the bronze around it.

## Lighting candles to overcome the darkness

### BISHOP'S CORNER

The beginning of the year is always a time for reflection, for looking back on the year that was and looking ahead to what the new year will bring. As I look ahead, it is not easy to ignore the darkness in our world. One area of darkness that remains is the scourge of abortion. Next week will be the 49th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade U.S. Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion and has since resulted in millions of unborn

lives taken in the womb.

But I do not like to curse the darkness. I prefer to light a candle and invite the presence of Christ to overcome the darkness. And even here, there is light!

Late last year, the Supreme Court heard arguments in the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health case. This case from the State of

Mississippi challenges the decision of Roe v. Wade and many experts think there is a real possibility that Roe v. Wade will be overturned or severely altered, significantly changing the legal framework for abortion in this country. The decision about life would then be returned to the states, which is constitutionally where it belongs. I urge you to pray and fast for a life-affirming outcome in the Dobbs case.

Too often, pregnant women facing difficult pregnancies are pushed to consider abortion as their only viable option. They may not know that it is wrong or realize the lifelong pain that comes with their decision. Thankfully, God is merciful! For those who have had an abortion, remember that God desires to forgive and heal you. Receive and take hold of that mercy and then help a young mom who is in the same place you were. Help them to avoid this "choice."

This brings me to another candle which is shedding light on the important ways that we can support moms in need. As we look ahead to the possibility of legalized abortion being significantly reduced or eliminated, we know that there will still be women who face a pregnancy under difficult circumstances.

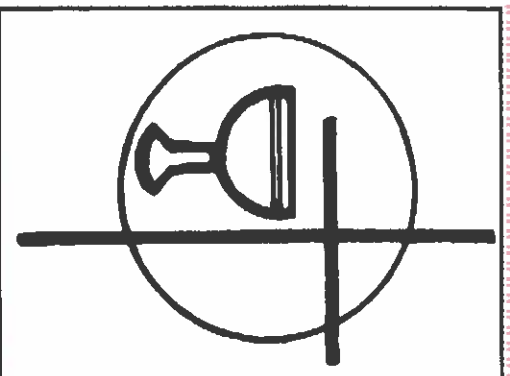

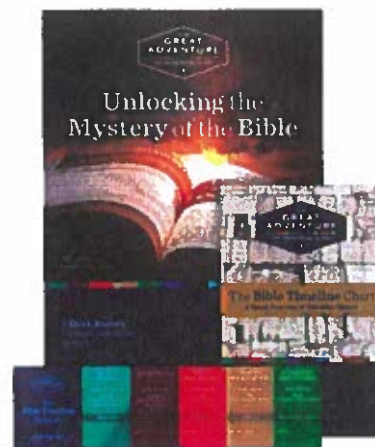

Hi there,

There is a story from 9-11 that has always struck me. When Welles Crowther was a young boy, his father gave him a red bandanna, which he always carried with him. On September 11, 2001, Welles Crowther saved numerous people from the upper floors of the World Trade Center South Tower, while sacrificing his own life. One of the survivors recalled "the man with the red bandanna" yelling "LISTEN, if you have the capability to help, you MUST help."

That statement has stayed with me ever since I watched a documentary on Welles. In fact, Welles Crowther has had a huge impact on my life.

We are living in a very difficult time, and we have the capability to help.
