GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Most Holy Trinity

In creative celebration of the Most Holy Trinity, pray a rosary with creation. Find a quiet place outside or sit near a window. Contemplate the amazing Divine Gift that is before you. Admire it. Study it. Become one with it. Ask for the guidance of Brother St. Francis as you pray: "You, Holy Father, are King of heaven and earth. You are three in one, God above all gods. You are good, all good, and supreme good, Lord God, living and true. You are love. You are beauty. You are gentleness. You are joy. You are hope and happiness." Admire the wonder and majesty of God in all that is around you. Ask for wisdom and understanding.

Begin each decade with the Our Father and conclude with the Glory Be.

Decade one: Contemplate God the Father. As you pray each bead with a Hail Mary, get lost in the grandeur of all that you see. Imagine the thousands and thousands of years of history that is before you. Envision a time when nothing existed. What is nothing? Lift your eyes, heart, and soul to the power and magnificence of the universe, its expanse and its endlessness. You are one with it all. God's creative power.


Decade two: Contemplate God the Son. Behold the squirrels, birds, and critters all conducting life's business. They have heartbeats just like yours. Praying each bead, become one with the incarnate divine life that flows through you and flows with the smallest of creatures. It is holy innocence and blessed life. Tenderness. Compassion, Mercy. Reverence. All want to be held, have a home, and be loved. God in all things. Emmanuel.

Decade three: Contemplate God the Holy Spirit. The changing of times and seasons happens often without notice. It is all within God's care and guided. We all belong. Behold the living, dying, and rising to new life. You are one with all time from beginning into eternity.

Decade Four: Contemplate God as One.

Decade Five: Contemplate God as three. All different while remaining one. The divine dance is being danced before you. Rest in what you see. Become what you see. We are all connected: God of the Holy Trinity, creation, our brothers and sisters, the animals, and the plants.

The rosary you have prayed celebrates the circle of connectedness and the intimate relationship we share with all things: a glimpse of the Trinity. ©LPi

Music educator organizes Ukraine benefit

MANITOWOC — When Stanislava Varshavski heard that Russia had begun invading her native Ukraine, she was in disbelief.

"I can't explain how I felt. I can say it was the shock of my life. The first three weeks, I couldn't eat, I couldn't sleep. I thought it was a nightmare," said Varshavski, director of music education for Holy Family Conservatory of Music in Manitowoc.

"I had relatives in Kharkov (her birth city), and it was one of the first cities that got bombed. My former apartment building was hit with rockets two times," she said. As far as she knows, her friends and extended family are safe, but Varshavski remembers feeling helpless. "I didn't know what I should do," she said.

In March, the conservatory and the Manitowoc community worked together to gather medical supplies and donations for Ukraine. "I was so amazed by Americans, that so many people so many miles away

cared. I was really touched," Varshavski said.

Spurred by continuing news of the invasion, the conservatory decided to organize a benefit concert for Ukraine, set for 2 p.m. on Sunday, May 15. The concert will feature professional musicians and various genres of music. "We are musicians here. I think the best way to help is to play music," said Varshavs-

ki, concert organizer. "It's about humanity. We need to fight evil and help people."

All money raised is designated for Catholic Relief Services for Ukrainian refugee supplies and housing, said Sr. Carol Ann Gambsky, administrator of Holy Family Conservatory of Music, in an email.

About English martyrs

- 1 England's Protestant Reformation began in 1534, when King Henry VIII declared himself head of the church there.
- 2 Many Catholics opposed the reforms and were martyred. They are the 40 Martyrs of England and Wales (Oct. 25). Hundreds more died between 1535 and 1670. May 4 is for their feast day.
- 3 Several martyrs have June feasts, including SS. John Fisher and Thomas More (June 22).
- 4 Seven Carthusian martyrs starved to death in June 1537, in Newgate Prison. They include Bl. Robert Salt and Bl. John Davy (June 6).
- 5 Thomas More's foster daughter, Margaret Clement, aided these Carthusians by smuggling food until the jailer, fearing his own safety, stopped her.

The Shrine offers many opportunities for prayer, including a beautiful outdoor rosary walk, a chapel where daily Mass is offered and an apparition oratory which provides visitors a space for quiet prayer and reflection. I invite you and your family to plan a visit.

Throughout these weeks, as we continue to rejoice in the risen Christ, look also to his mother. As Jesus said to Peter at the foot of the cross, "She is your mother." She is our mother. Let us honor her. God bless you and your family.
