GOSPEL MEDITATION

4th Sunday of Advent



An entire town is wiped out by fire, a tornado rips through several neighborhoods, a bomb claims a maternity hospital and a sudden heart attack takes the life of a soul mate. Life is unpredictable and dramatic. Many buy into the sad illusion that the securities and familiarities we see around us today will remain forever: our homes, our friends, our spouses, our churches, and even our health. We are stunned and shaken by a sudden change, finding ourselves bewildered, mortified, and even embittered. We do not like change, especially change driven by sources beyond our control. Are there any guarantees in life? We often live as if our lives come with lifetime warranties. When they break, they can be fixed or replaced. Such is not the case. Many things are irreplaceable and unable to be fixed. During life's inevitable chaos, God says: "Do not be afraid." Seriously? How can one not be afraid when things are falling apart?

Fear is normal and it has a purpose. It is unrealistic, and somewhat unhealthy, to strive to live without any fear. Fear teaches us lessons and can be a catalyst to discovering more profound things. What we do with fear and how we understand it is critical. Fear can either cripple us or move us forward. God does not want fear to cripple us. If we look around at all that can change in our lives and consider what we might have to do, we can easily wallow in the mire of self-misery. Or we can step up to the challenge, as Mary did, and do what needs doing! We can stand tall, as did Joseph, and do the right and just thing! What gives us this courage? Faith.

God is with us. This is the focus of our Advent preparations. We need to be reminded that we are not in this alone. God not only made us and loves us, but God keeps us! In the person of Jesus Christ, God is the sign we need to persevere! Do not be afraid and do not be unbelieving! Hold fast to what God has done in giving us His only begotten Son. We do not have to anxiously attempt to control life's unpredictability. God has blessed us with the birth of His Son. Trust that He is with us and will not abandon us, even in death. ©LPi

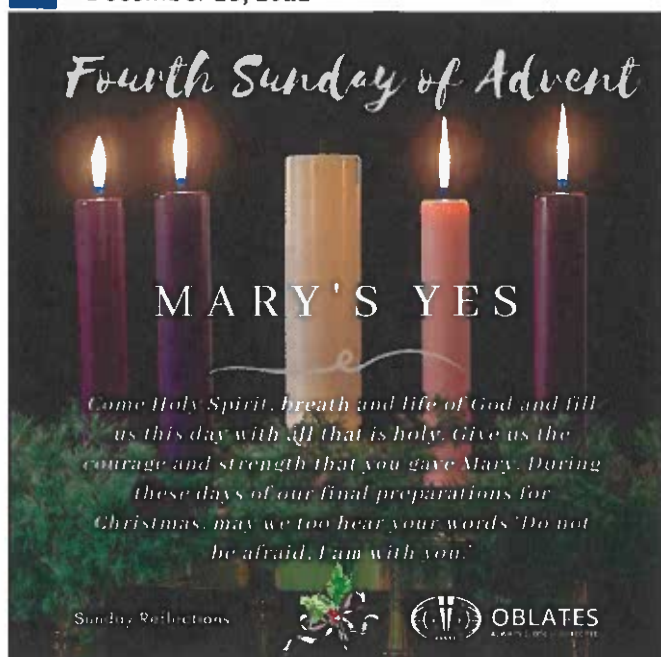
Genesis Class Schedule for Wednesday's for December:

Charitable IRA Rollovers: As the year ends, please note that Charitable IRA Rollovers allow individuals aged 70 ½ years or older to make a qualified charitable distribution directly to Corpus Christi Parish from traditional individual retirement accounts (IRA). Charitable IRA Rollovers are tax-free and not included in a donor's annual income.

Also note that at age 72 the IRS requires withdrawal of funds from IRAs in statutorily mandated annual increments known as Required Minimum Distributions (or RMDs). As you are aware, the way traditional IRAs are structured, an individual receives a tax deduction at the time of the contribution on the condition that withdrawals are taxed as ordinary income. This means two things: 1) at age 72 distributions are required (there is a significant penalty for not taking the required distribution) and 2) the RMD funds may push your adjusted income into a higher tax bracket.

A Qualified Charitable Distribution/Rollover may be a suitable tax-relief strategy. Starting at age 70 ½, you may direct IRA distributions to qualified 501(c)3 charities like Corpus Christi Parish. Charitable distributions satisfy the Internal Revenue Service's required distribution rules, and since the money is going to a charity you're not required to report the distribution as income (or pay taxes on the distribution).

What is the Original Meaning of Christmas?

Christmas is the feast of the Incarnation, the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ, true God and true man, as a little baby in Bethlehem.

While many Christians recognize Christmas as a celebration of Jesus' birth, the solemnity is also a festival of his Incarnation, that is, God becoming human in the person of Jesus. The term itself is an abbreviation of the phrase "Christ Mass," which reflects the primary understanding of Christmas as a feast day within the Church year, connected to the Eucharist.

One of the great opportunities we have these days is to savor the Christmas season. **Christmas is not a single day; it's a season** in which to enter more deeply into the mystery of the One who came to become one of us.

Behold the Light of the World
How do you bring your light and the light of Christ into the world?

The question put to us simply by the Infant's presence is:
Do I allow God to love me?

Christmas is a season of great joy. It is a time of God showing His great love for us. It can be a time of healing and renewed strength. Christmas is when we celebrate the birth of the Christ child. God sent His Son, Jesus, into the world to be born. His birth brought great joy to the world. Shepherds, wise men, and angels all shared in the excitement of knowing about this great event. They knew this was no ordinary baby. The prophets had told of His coming hundreds of years before. The star stopped over Bethlehem just to mark the way for those who were looking for this special child.

Let us look to the crib and pray, asking the Blessed Mother: "O Mary, show us Jesus!"

Christmas Symbols

Gifts

Giving gifts is a ritual directly from the Bible. We give each other gifts because God set out to give us the gifts of creation, His Son and Himself. When we see Christmas presents they remind us of the most precious gift God granted us – the way to Heaven through Jesus. And like the 3 Wise Men who brought Jesus gold, frankincense, and myrrh we, too give gifts to each other.

Christmas Tree

The tree is an evergreen – it does not die or fade away or lose its needles in winter. In this sense they have come to represent the immortality of the resurrected Christ.

Lights

Originally lights were candles – meant to symbolize Christ, his self-giving love and gift of life to us. The candle provides light and warmth as it consumes its own substance, the wax. So, too, Jesus gave his own substance – his life – so that we might find divine light. And when we have found divine light for ourselves, we, too, are enabled through the power of the Holy Spirit to give ourselves to others. Christmas is the feast of love, where we share gifts with each other as Christ shared the gift of life with us.

Christmas Wreath

Like the Christmas tree, the wreath is made from an evergreen, symbolizing our everlasting life in Christ. In addition, it is round, a circle with no beginning and no end, reminding us of God, who is eternal, never beginning or ending.

Christmas Carols

Carols are said to have begun back in the 13th century. Some believe that songs have been sung at the darkest time of the year – the Winter Solstice-for thousands of years in order to bring light to the season and celebrate the turn towards longer days. Some originated as stories, prayers, poems and chants. They symbolize everything that Christmas stands for.

Angels

In Greek, the word 'angel' means messenger. Angels are the messengers of God, who played a prominent part in the birth of Jesus. They are personified as heavenly creatures with wings that symbolize immortality, virtue, and peace. Love, and innocence while the halo is the symbol of their native to Heaven. Angels are believed to be immortal, who live in Heaven, and act as intermediaries between God and humankind.

Bells

Bells act as a medium between Heaven and Earth, and their clappers represent communication between humans and god. The sound of the bells announce the birth of Christ on Earth.

Stars

The Christmas Star represents the Star of Bethlehem which was the beacon of light for the Wise Men to find Jesus.

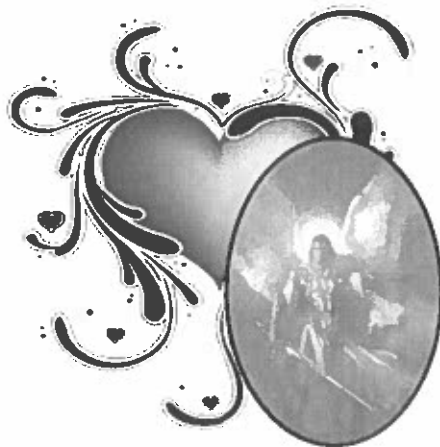
Be Bold Protecting The Gift of Christmas
