New podcast launches for young adults

FREEDOM — When Eve Vanden Heuvel struggled to find podcasts specifically for a Catholic young adult audience, she decided to create her own. The first episode of “The Everyday Saint” was launched on Jan. 6. Vanden Heuvel, 19, will release a new episode each Friday. The motto for the podcast is “Young Catholics inspiring young Catholics.”

“This podcast will be interview based as I invite a young, college-aged Catholic each week to talk about their faith and why it’s important to them,” said Vanden Heuvel. “The intent is to provide inspiration to other young Catholics pursuing faith

“‘The Everyday Saint’ got its name because I knew I wanted to invite people that are your ‘everyday Saints’ onto the show,” said Vanden Heuvel.

“We are sending the message to the

guests of St. John’s Homeless Shelter (in Green Bay) that our community cares about them and we want to make their winter more manageable,” she said. “I think that is so important, ... that message for the shelter guests to know that people care about them offers dignity and hope.”

Gallagher started Long Johns for St.

John’s after hearing that St. John’s needed socks. She thought that she could help by organizing a collection. Shelter staff informed her that thermal underwear — also known as “long johns” — was a greater need, thus the name of the campaign.

The Presentation of the Lord

1 The feast of the Presentation of the Lord is celebrated Feb. 2, 40 days after Jesus' birth.

2 A firstborn son was brought to the Temple in Jerusalem on his 40th day to offer him to the Lord and then redeem him back. The redemption price was a lamb, or two turtledoves or pigeons for poor parents.

3 In Eastern Catholic and Orthodox churches, the feast is called *Hypapante tou Kyriou* - "the meeting of the Lord."

4 At the Temple, the Holy Family met Simeon, an aged priest, and Anna, an elderly widow and prophet.

5 The day is also called Candlemas because people have candles blessed then in honor of "the Light of the World."
