GOSPEL MEDITATION

March 5, 2023

The Second Sunday of Lent

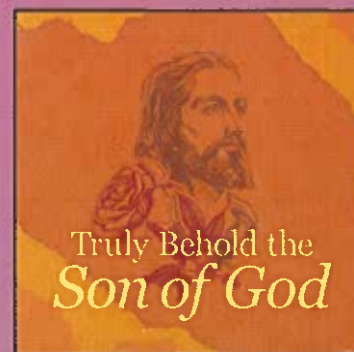
As a kid I remember looking at my sister and thinking, "No man is ever going to marry her. She is way too-my sister!" I couldn't see her as anything except my goofy, emotional, cooties-laden sister. Years later, on her wedding day, I remember seeing how her husband looked at her, he was totally in love with her, his watery eyes full of overwhelmed joy, drinking in her beauty and grace. He was the one who actually saw her. Blinded by familiarity, I had not been able to see her until now. She was glorious. I finally saw how beautiful my sister really was.

Jesus is transfigured before Peter, James, and John. His face shone like the sun and his clothes dazzle with heavenly light. If it's a miracle, it is so related to the apostles' perception of the glory of Jesus. The physical spectacle reveals how the Father perceives the Son, so to speak: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to him." The Son is always bathed in the Father's love. It's only just now that they finally perceive it.

Who could possibly give his or her heart totally to Jesus? If we perceive him to be just another teacher, symbol, or moral example, we can't. But if the Holy Spirit gives us eyes to see that he is the Beloved Son of God, who makes our humanity not just pleasing to God but filled with glory ... then who can resist him? Perhaps only the lovers are the ones who properly see.

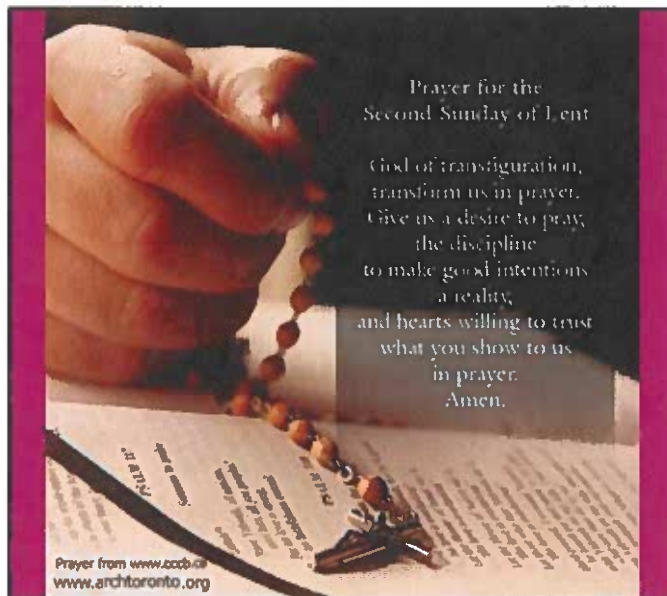

Lenten Regulations

Each Catholic is asked to preserve the penitential purpose and character of Lent, which begins Ash Wednesday. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday until they celebrate their 59th birthday are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may only eat one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Father Tony Birdsall Prayer & Reflection Garden Update

We as a parish are very fortunate to have this beautiful and peaceful place where we are all welcome to come and spend time in prayer and reflection. We want to preserve this garden for future generations to come and experience this unique space to pray as well.

In consulting with a local landscape company to get an estimate for the 2023 season, which is approx. \$2745.00 and includes:

Spring & Fall cleanup - Irrigation startup & shutdown - Installation & removal of burlap

It was also brought to our attention that there are some big repairs that will need to be addressed in the future.

1. Condition of the garden walls

These are dry stack walls and are falling over from water drainage and the roots of the cedars that get burlapped. This will continue as the cedars grow

2. Cedars along the edge that get burlapped

They have a lifespan and are at mid to end of that lifespan

They are getting holes in them and are losing aesthetics, while we are spending thousand of dollars to burlap them

Eventually, they will get too large and need to be removed

3. *A preliminary proposal was given with an estimate of approx. \$22,300.00 for the following:

Removal of all exterior cedar trees and root system

Repair of East section of compromised existing wall:

Removal of all stones, reconstruction of wall, installation of geo grid textile behind wall, installation of corrugated drain pipes through wall.

Installation of 4ft tall decorative (black) metal fence around perimeter of garden, concreted into ground

* Prices subject to change upon final agreement of goods and services selected, as well as, any unforeseen bedrock or objects unearthed during excavation.

This preliminary proposal will be given to the Buildings and Grounds committee and they will monitor this as to when the repairs may need to be done and how to move forward to have funds to cover this large expense.

Spiraling Adventure of the Liturgical Year Continues

Just as the four seasons cycle from Spring to Winter, so too, the Liturgical seasons have their appointed time to manifest themselves through the richness of their rituals, symbols, songs and prayers. Our journey through Advent not only marked the beginning of our Liturgical Year, but also held the promise that no matter how dark, long and cold the nights can be, they held the promise of the coming Light that would return. Then, guided by the Star of Bethlehem we were reminded that we can all find our way home and awaken to the Bethlehem that dwells in each of us, a season when all creation groaned in the one great act of giving birth – Christ among us. We have now passed through the small restful period of Ordinary Time to the Liturgical Season of Lent, the season that initiates us into the most sacred season of the Liturgical Year, but also a season of real soul searching. The Church gives us this time to retreat into the wilderness with Jesus and enter a time of real conversion for new life to spring forth.

When Jesus retreated into the desert, he knew what lay ahead. Those 40 days were His time to prepare and reflect on the work He accomplished, people He met, and the behaviors of the various groups He encountered. Holy Week would be one huge event after another. Forty days in the desert was His opportunity to settle His soul and mind on what was about to happen.

The Church gives us the gift of these 40 days as a time to quiet ourselves and enter the desert of our own lives, settle ourselves and do some deep-down soul searching. It is a time to take stock of our own lives and reflect on the lessons, values, and principles that Jesus teaches and instills in us. It is a sacred time to ponder and reflect on the glory of Holy Week. It is also a time to revive and renew our joy and love for the richness of our faith, spirituality, and religion. It is a time to feel God's love and ponder what His resurrection means for us.

Like Jesus, our 40 days will also end in the glory of the resurrection. Our goal is to get to our own resurrection- (a revival, renewal, a lifting of our minds, hearts, and souls) by reflecting on the process of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. There is much work to accomplish in ourselves and we might think that 40 days is not long enough. Practice embodying the heart of Jesus. Listen to the Gospel message and learn to love as He loved, live as He lived and serve as He served. We learn. We grow. We transform. This is the ascension and resurrection of our hearts, minds and souls. Jesus journeys with us. He brings us along with Him on the path to resurrection. When you sit in Church during Holy Week there is some darkness, but do not wallow in darkness. There is always dark before the light. Go through Lent with your eyes set on Easter and the glory of the resurrection. Know it is about all of us being filled with the love of God and the light of the risen Jesus.

What are you going to do with your 40 days? What are you going to do to prepare for your own resurrection? What do you want to continue doing? What do you want to let go of? Do you want to venture out in a new direction? Will you reflect on where your life is heading? What will these 40 days be for you as you rise up? Your resurrection is not about your death. It is about lifting your soul, opening your heart to the wonder of learning about your own spirituality.

The highlight of the Liturgical year occurs on Easter when we are all lifted up on that day. I can imagine Jesus saying to us, *"Pick up your cross. Believe in me and we will rise together."*

From the Principal

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

The imposition of ashes is amazing to children. They marvel at the sight of adults wearing ashes. At first they wear their own ashes as a sign that "I am one of them" or "I belong." As they hear the language about sin, forgiveness and repentance, they begin to wear them as an admission that "yes, I, too, am a sinner." This is not an easy step for children who are repeatedly told that they are "wonderful" and "capable." It also flies in the face of frequent adult insistence that they can make good choices which is often taken to mean "if you try hard enough, you won't be a sinner." Ash Wednesday makes it easier to make the admission that "yes, I too am a sinner" by setting it in the presence of everyone else making the same admission. We are all first marked with the cross using water (and sometimes oil) at our baptisms. At that time to be marked with the cross is a wonderful thing. We are identified as the loved children of God. On Ash Wednesday we are marked with the cross using ashes and the words, "remember you are dust." The ashes and words remind us that we are not so wonderful. In fact, we are all sinners. Fortunately, the sign is not an X, marking us as hopeless, but a cross reminding us that God loves and forgives us, sinners though we be.

In spite of their interest in the ashes, for children Ash Wednesday is mainly the beginning of Lent. Lent is for them spring training for

disciples. We begin the season admitting to ourselves and others that we are not perfect disciples and are fortunate that God loves and forgives us anyway. We then commit to doing better. When children are offered specific doable disciplines that will help them be better at praying, Bible reading, and serving others, they respond enthusiastically. Having committed themselves to such disciple training, they come to communion as to the training table. Here they are reminded of God's love for those who try and do well and also for those who try and do not do as well as they wish.

Please join us during our school masses on Wednesdays at 8:20. Lenten prayer services on Monday mornings at 8:10 in the school foyer.
