

Easter Sunday and Object Permanence

When you play peekaboo with a very young baby who has not yet developed object permanence, you actually feel kind of mean. As soon as your hands obscure your face, their little eyes widen with alarm and their expression crumbles into confusion and despair.

Because they can no longer see you, they believe you no longer exist. Their little brains are unable to understand that just because a thing cannot be seen, it is still there, still alive, still full of love and care and protection.

Aw, man, you can hear them thinking. I guess I don't have a mom anymore.

On Easter morning, Mary Magdalene sees the burial cloth but no body. Her human mind makes sense of the situation the best way it knows how, she assumes the Lord has been taken. I'm sure I would have thought the same thing, in her position.

She cannot conceive, on her own, the reality that Christ has risen from the dead. It doesn't matter that he has told his disciples again and again that this will happen. They weren't ready to understand then.

In many ways, Easter is when the human race really achieved object permanence. But we still struggle with it, don't we? I certainly do. So often I can be heard accusing God: "You weren't there. Where were you? I couldn't find you."

But I looked for him in the flesh. I looked for him in the stale yeast of the world — in money or success or affirmation or (worst of all) convenience and pleasure. Of course, I would not find him there, among the dead. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth.


**Liturgy of the Word!** Children ages 4 through 3rd grade are invited to participate at St. Joe's 10am Mass on Sunday.





# Easter

Easter is the spring festival celebrating the resurrection of Christ.

Easter is the oldest
Christian holiday and
the most important day
of the Church year. All the other
movable feasts
and entire Liturgical Year
are arranged around Easter.
It is calculated based on the lunar
calendar and follows
the first full moon
after the spring equinox - the first
day of spring.

It is a 50-day season, called Eastertide – a season to continue and nurture our faith formation

The first Sunday after the full moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox.
Follows Lent and Holy Week

The Resurrection of Christ

### Alternate Names

Pascha - Easter is the Anglo-Saxon name.
It is also borrowed from the Jewish word for "Passover."



## Symbols of Easter

### **Easter Bunny**

There are quite a few reasons why the rabbit is associated with Easter. Easter is a celebration of life, more specifically rebirth.

- The burrow of the rabbit signifies the tomb of Christ from which he rises.
- The hare symbolized the moon. The date of Easter depends on the lunar cycle and observed on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the March equinox.

# **Decorated Easter Eggs**

Eggs have always been recognized as a symbol of life. During the spring-time of the year, most ancient cultures celebrated their spring festivals by gifting and eating dyed eggs. Even in folklore, eggs are sacred.

The Easter egg symbolizes the tomb of Jesus from which he rose to a new life.

The Easter egg hunt is another custom which involves children hiding away decorated Easter eggs for others to "seek and find."

### **Spring Chicks**

The spring chicks coming out of the eggs resemble Jesus Christ coming out of his tomb. The resurrection of Jesus Christ is an allegory for rebirth and new life, which is symbolized by spring chicks.



# Easter is an opportunity for us to cultivate a spirit that defines who we are as Christians.

What does living the spirit of the Easter season really mean? It means to:

### Live With Joy

Joy is the deep-down feeling that cannot be taken away. The Passion and Resurrection of Jesus teaches us that suffering can be transformed through faith. We are able to hold on to that joy even in the midst of any sorrow we may encounter.

# Live Without Fear

The Resurrection teaches us that if God can overcome anything, even death, we can too. When the Risen Christ appeared to the women and the disciples he said, "Do not be afraid." Our faith allows us to trust that God can help us overcome our deepest of sorrows.

# Live With New Eyes

Easter allows us the opportunity to live with a sense of newness. We can use these 50 days to cultivate an Easter spirit that enables us to embrace joy, live without fear and see the world as if we are seeing it for the first time.



### Easter Lily

One of the parallels between the Resurrection and the Easter lily is the way the flower blooms. The bulb grows deep beneath in the soil. While there is no observable activity above the ground, the bulb grows hidden from sight and then one day, suddenly shoots up and blooms. This imagery holds likeness to the manner-in-which Jesus rose from his tomb.

### Dogwood

It is believed that the cross on which Jesus was crucified was made of the wood from a dogwood tree.

The Cross is represented by the four petals of the dogwood flower. Four petals often carry marks on their edges which resemble the nails used to crucify Jesus. The center of the dogwood flower often looks like a crown which symbolizes the crown of thorns. The red color of dogwood berries represents the blood of Jesus.

### Lamb

The symbol of the lamb is strongly rooted in Christian belief – signifying the sacrifice of Jesus. This comes from the Jewish Passover, the event where every family sacrificed a lamb in good faith. Jesus laid down his life for all humanity and thus is recognized as the Passover Lamb.
