Good People of St. Vincent de Paul,

One of our school parents said to me, "Geez, Father, with all of these closings and cancellations due to the Coronavirus we've had to give up a lot more than we were planning to for Lent." It has indeed been a sacrificial season.



Now we have received word that **effective immediately**, all public celebrations of Mass across the Archdiocese are to be suspended until further notice. Please see the letter from our Archbishop on the back of this page.

Take heart to know that Fr. Zipp and I will be here at St. Vincent de Paul every day celebrating Mass — and, as always, even without anyone else present, Mass will be offered for all of you. Every single time we priests celebrate Mass, we hold in our prayers the members of our community who are unable to be with us in person — those in hospitals, nursing homes, prisons, etc. The gift of the Eucharist is never restricted. Rather each Mass is a mystery to bring salvation through Jesus to the whole world.

I borrow some inspiration from a priest in Italy who, in response to Mass cancelations, appealed to his parishioners to send him photos of themselves. He then "repopulated" his church by taping the photos to the church pews so he wouldn't feel so alone as he was celebrating Mass. So, yes! Send pictures of yourselves and your families to churchinfo@saintvdp.org or mail them to the parish office. We will affix your photos to the pews. Your smiling and devout faces can still surround us as we celebrate Mass.

Who else has some good ideas about how we can continue to spread the love and good cheer? How can we offer help to those who might be most suffering or vulnerable? We have a Catholic Tradition in which St. Francis kissed a leper. St. Teresa of Calcutta touched the "untouchables." I pray that during this season we can still find ways to draw near to one another. It would be wonderful if, by the time this virus has run its course, we would be able to say that even through "social distancing" we have grown closer together than ever before.

Wherever you are, there is the Church of St. Vincent de Paul. We here at Mission Control are ready to help you day or night. Call or email if there is anything we can do.

Stay spirited! Take care of yourselves. Pray for and take care of one another. St. Corona, pray for us. (Yes, there really is a St. Corona!)

From our Archbishop

March 18, 2020

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

State Officials have communicated to religious leaders that the next two weeks are critical for the containment of the COVID-19/coronavirus and that all congregational gatherings should



be avoided. While I am sure that the advice is startling for those of any creed, it particularly hits hard for Catholics, given our beliefs about the Mass and the Eucharist.

In light of that advice, after consulting with the Presbyteral Council and College of Consultors, and having learned that an active parish priest in another U.S. diocese has tested positive for the virus - unknowingly putting his parish at risk prior to the manifestation of any symptoms - I have made the difficult decision to suspend all regularly scheduled public celebrations of Mass in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul Minneapolis, effective immediately. Given both the moral impossibility of attending Mass, as well as the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass that was extended to the faithful of the Archdiocese last week, please rest assured that the missing of Mass in these conditions should not weigh on your conscience.

Anticipating that the need might arise for a funeral or wedding Mass in this period, a limited exception has been granted for those liturgies, provided that any liturgical celebration would comply with the directives that will be issued in a memorandum to clergy of the Archdiocese.

It pains my heart to have to make this decision since I know how many of you deeply love the Mass as I do. This decision will be re-evaluated in two weeks' time in light of any local developments and the latest advice of civil authorities and experts.

The priests of the Archdiocese will gratefully continue to offer Masses daily for the good of the faithful and for an end to this health crisis. While unable to attend in person, the faithful are encouraged to be spiritually united with the priest celebrants as they pray for the strengthening of this local Church. I am grateful that many parishes have already found ways to broadcast the Mass and other spiritual devotions online, over the radio, or on TV, allowing the faithful to be remotely present at Mass in these challenging times and to make a spiritual communion. Options for Mass and prayer resources may be found at archspm.org/covid19.

Moreover, in their inspiring desire to serve, the priests of the Archdiocese are committed during the next two weeks to continue exploring with the lay faithful possibilities for limited public celebrations of the Mass at the parish or at the Archdiocesan level that would respect the most up-to-date recommendations from the Department of Health and allow us to continue to do our part to stop the spread of COVID-19/coronavirus in our community. Knowing that so many Catholics are deeply Eucharistic in their spirituality, our priests and deacons are also committed to expanding possibilities for adoration and private prayer, moving adoration, where necessary, to larger church spaces to facilitate appropriate social distancing.

I am grateful that confessions will continue to be heard at parishes, with appropriate precautions and adaptions taken in accordance with the guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control. Priests will also continue to respond to sacramental emergencies and provide anointing and Viaticum to the extent this is possible. Please do not hesitate to contact your local parish to make them aware of any sacramental needs for the sick or the dying.

As we today mark a special day of fasting, abstinence and prayer invoking God's Providential care for our Archdiocese, our country and the world, I invite you to consider the upcoming "fast" from the Eucharist as a way to draw ever closer to our Lord, especially as we experience a more intense longing for Jesus, present in the Eucharist. During this time of Eucharistic fasting,

I would encourage each of us to offer intercessory prayer each day for the health and safety of our community, especially healthcare workers, and to join in solidarity with the many Catholics throughout the world who regularly are unable to receive communion, due to persecution or to an absence of priests.

Please continue to pray for those who have died from COVID-19/coronavirus, those who mourn them, those who are sick and the many who care for them. I ask you to keep in your prayers, as well, Governor Tim Walz and Commissioner Jan Malcom from the Minnesota Department of Health, and all public servants working to keep our communities safe.

May Mary, Consoler of the Afflicted, keep us close to each other and to the loving heart of her son.

1. Pray for each other and our staff. Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world

gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27) Spend time in prayer and focus your attention and energy on God and others during this time, and do not allow worry to take away the inner peace that God can provide in difficult times. Offer up your sacrifices and unite your suffering to the redemptive suffering of Jesus on the cross during this Lenten season.

- 2. Be patient. These are new challenges for all of us, and it may take time to make decisions and communicate them, especially with the speed of the changes happening day to day as the virus spreads. We will make information available as soon as possible via our website and other communication tools.
- **3. Check our website first.** To stay informed, you can check our website (saintydp.org) and Facebook page for information on the latest updates to answer any questions you may have.
- 4. Continue your giving, if possible. As Mass attendance has dropped off considerably over the last couple of weeks, so have our collections. We know that this may be a time of financial hardship for many, but if you have the ability to continue your usual giving—please consider mailing in your weekly offering, or using our online giving tool at saintvdp.org/giving. If you happen to be in a financial position to increase your giving, please consider doing so to help make up the difference for those who cannot give. This will allow us to continue to pay our bills and offer ministries to our parishioners.
- **5. Expect changes & new challenges.** We are making plans for the upcoming months, but there are many factors we cannot control that may lead to last-minute changes. Know that our staff are working hard to continue our parish mission to know, love, and serve the Lord and each other.

Together, we will weather this storm—with God's help!

BIZAA Mission Trip Rescheduled


Your Supplies Donations are Appreciated!
