



A short story in the life of Saint Teresa of Avila perfectly summarizes the reasoning behind Eucharistic Adoration. One day Saint Teresa heard someone say, "If only I had lived at the time of Jesus ... If only I had seen Jesus ... If only I had talked with Jesus." She responded, "But do we not have in the Eucharist the living,

true and real Jesus present before us?
Why look for more?"

From Our Pastor

It's fitting that our national election day is always juxtaposed with All Saints Day. It reminds us where true power lies. We as Catholics witness to the truth that a poor, simple nun like Saint "Mother" Teresa

In too many ways we give in to the cult of celebrity worship regarding our politicians. We elevate them as some sort of larger-than-life saviors who are to deliver us from all our social, economic, and moral problems. If we are expecting our politicians to direct the course of our family and moral lives, then we have given away too much power. This is not the work of presidents, but the work of mothers, fathers, priests, nuns, and all of God's most simple peasants.






