A new British King was crowned earlier this month at Westminster Abbey. We Americans might be tempted to disregard the Monarchy in England as an irrelevant or antiquated institution. Yet there truly is something honorable about it.



At Queen Elizabeth's funeral in September, so many commentators praised her commitment to duty. The Queen saw herself as a servant – someone to embody a sovereign goodness to all the people. She was not a politician like the Prime Minister or a member of the Parliament. Her power was not legislative, but higher – even heavenly ordained. Her role was to remain above the fray and to remind the people that there was something more important than politics.


## Feed My Starving Children


