

St. Augustine Spotlight - Fourth Sunday of Lent

March 11, 2018

Anyone who has watched football and other sports has seen the "John 3:16" sign hanging in the stands. We get to hear that verse in the gospel today, in case you never looked it up. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." It is closely followed by "Whoever believes in him will not be condemned." Now some people focus on the "believing in the Son" and being saved thing, and this has caused many an argument between Christian religions. Here's how I view this. We profess to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and is God being one part of the Trinity. He died so that we could have eternal life.

If we believe all of this, then we must believe in everything that He taught and showed us from the Father. He taught us that the most important commandment is to love God with your whole heart, soul, and mind. The second most important is to love your neighbor as yourself. If we profess to believe in Jesus, but then ignore his most important teachings, where does that leave us?

I view it this way. If there is a rickety bridge across a deep gorge, and someone asks me if I have faith in the bridge, and I reply, "Yes," I do not really have faith if I refuse to walk across that bridge. Similarly, if I profess belief in Jesus but do not even attempt to live my life according to His Word, choosing instead to live by the world's standards, do I really have faith? It really comes down to talking the talk versus walking the walk.

During this Lent, may we reflect on our faith and then ask ourselves if our lives really reflect that faith in our day-to-day actions? If not, then Lent is a great time to get things right. Thinking about the two greatest commandments is a great place to start.






