ST. AUGUSTINE SPOTLIGHT JUNE 17 ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Gospel from today's mass has two parables from Jesus that deal with God's gifts to us that are rooted in nature. In the first, a man sows seed and it yields fruit, even though he doesn't understand how. We've come a long way in understanding biology, agriculture, and agronomy since Jesus spoke these words, so there are likely parishioners and students affiliated with U.F. who are saying to themselves, "I understand plant biology, growth, etc."* However, the point is that each of us is given gifts (seeds) by God, and just as his Word does not return to him without effect, his plan is for these gifts to be used by us according to his will and to his glory, even though we may not understand how and why. Do we have faith in God's providence to develop the gifts he has given us to their fullest in his kingdom?

In the second parable Jesus talks about how the tiny mustard seed grows into a large plant that even the birds find suitable for a home. Perhaps we feel that we have been shorted by God in gifts and therefore we are either off the hook or are incapable of returning anything of value to him. This is easy to do when we see others who seem to be more abundantly blessed – at least from our point of view. However, as Paul said in his letter to the Corinthians (1 Corinthians 12), we each have different gifts, but the Spirit works all of these varied gifts in each of us.

Rather than feeling left out or deficient, may we pray for the Spirit to guide us and strengthen us in using God's varied gifts every day in our lives, even though we may not always appreciate how richly we have been blessed or how they serve his purpose.

*As a professor of molecular genetics and microbiology at the U.F. College of Medicine, I am often asked if I find conflict between my profession in science and my faith. Most assuredly, I answer, "No!" First, Catholics are not required to believe a literal interpretation of Genesis, so we can believe that the universe is 14 billion years old and not 5,000. Of course I believe that God is the author of creation of the universe and life itself. It is the wonder of life, even in organisms as allegedly simple as bacteria that I study, that make me marvel at the beauty of God's creation, regardless of how he brought it into being and to its current form. I feel blessed that my profession enables me to learn and teach about God's creation in nature. No one can rightfully claim that intelligence or education are incompatible with Christian faith.

Orar por las Vocaciones Sacerdotales y Religiosas




"El Concilio Vaticano II resalta la responsabilidad de los laicos para orar y apoyar las vocaciones."
