STEWARDSHIP SPOTLIGHT

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME OCTOBER 21, 2018

This past week we saw the third major natural disaster over the past couple of months. Hurricane Michael devastated Panama Peach and Mexico Beach. Before that Hurricane Florence wreaked havoc on the Carolinas, and Indonesia experienced an earthquake and tsunami that killed thousands. These natural disasters evoke questions of our responses to them on two different levels. On a philosophical level, people question why God lets them happen. On a moral/practical level, how do we respond as Christians to help our brothers and sisters who are suffering from the disasters?

It is clear that God's intention in His creation is not to provide a strictly comfortable and safe environment. Nature that produces extreme beauty in sunsets, mountains, waterfalls, and rainbows, must also be capable of acts of destructive power in earthquakes, volcanoes, storms, and floods. Similarly, the capacity of humans to harm others is a natural consequence of our free will to live in love as God commands, or not. Our challenge is to have faith in God's love through all of these trials and to respond to them in love.

Essentially everyone who is reading this is likely in a secure home with food, medicine, and entertainment. At this instant, there are millions of our brothers and sisters suffering from natural disasters and human injustice. What should we do?

First, pray. Pray for the well-being, healing, and faith of those who are afflicted. Then meditate on words of St. James from the Gospel a few weeks ago (Jas 2:15-18) "If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." How do we expect our prayer to be answered? By a miraculous appearance of food, water, and shelter? By God inspiring others to be generous, but not us? No, the only person we know can be changed by our prayer is us. We should be praying that we answer God's call to be his healing hands and heart in these disasters.

To that end, relative to Hurricane Michael, Catholic Charities of Northwest Florida is accepting donations for victims of the storm. Their web page is: ccnwfl.org. For the Indonesian earthquake and tsunami, Catholic Relief Services is www.crs.org.
