ST. AUGUSTINE REFLECTION

NOVEMBER 17, 2019

As we near the end of the liturgical year, we are reminded in the readings that the Earth will not last forever. Eventually will be the end of it all, the Second Coming of Jesus, and the establishment of the new Kingdom of God. It is most likely for us that the "end" will not be this eschatological event, but our own death in this age. We all know of particular sects that claim to know the exact date for the end of the world. Jesus tells us that we can't tell by current events. "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Elsewhere (MT 24:36), Jesus says "But of that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father alone." So how should we live this understanding? Well, for one, not like the proud and evildoers, because the first reading from Malachi tells us that they do not end well. No, as St. Paul says in the second reading, we should work diligently and mind our own business. And how should we do that? Follow the greatest commandments to love God and love our neighbor.

Last Monday, many people gathered at St. A's to package 900 Thanksgiving meals to be dis-

tributed by Catholic Charities. I have detailed other service activities over the past couple of weeks. Here are two more excellent service opportunities:

Altrusa House (altrusahouse.com) is a licensed adult day health care program that provides for adults with disabilities or special needs. It enables family members who care for special needs adults at home with some needed time off. Altrusa House needs volunteers to help with this.

No One Dies Alone (NODA) is a volunteer program at Shands Hospital that provides the presence of a companion to dying patients who would otherwise be alone in their final hours because of not having family or friends with them. Matthew Kuizon - Alumnus

Hello! I'm an alum who is now a theology teacher and campus minister at Jesuit High School in Tampa. I've been happily married

for over a year now to my wife, Catherine, and our first daughter, Lily Marie, was born just over two months ago!

When I speak with others about college, I can't help but speak very fondly of my time in Gainesville. This fondness has grown over the years because of how much my involvement as a student (and employee after graduation) has had an impact on my life and my relationship with God. St. A's became a home for me, just as it has for students who have come before and after me.

I first began my involvement near the end

of freshman year. I was raised Catholic by my parents, who are devout Catholics themselves, attending Mass on Sundays and prayer groups for married couples weekly. However, throughout my freshman year, I struggled with living out my faith because of the many enticements in college that often pull us away from the Lord. Although I went to Mass and strove to pray regularly, I didn't allow the Lord to really enter my heart.

It was only when I hit rock bottom that I allowed to Lord to heal me, to put my heart back together, so that I may give it to Him alone. He used this community to carry out this work. At the heart of St. A's is a community with a deep love for Jesus in the Eucharist. It is from this devotion that this community emanates a deep joy-a joy rooted in the certitude that they are known and loved by God-and seek to invite the university community into that same certitude through lifelong, intentional discipleship of Jesus Christ.

I have countless memories that I could share, but one stands out when I'm asked about Catholic Gators. Just before graduation, my friends and I went off to the Appalachian mountains to spend some quality time together before going our separate ways. I have this photo of us by a lake which I still look at from time to time. Now that time has passed, each of these people have gone on to become sisters, seminarians, or are happily married with kids. This goes to show that those years spent at St. A's continue to bear fruit in my life to this day, even through life's difficulties and hardships.

As a theology teacher who teaches seniors right before they leave for college, I always tell students interested in attending UF to go check out the Catholic student center. If you want to grow in your relationship with the Lord and establish authentic friendships that will last you a lifetime, there's no better place in Gainesville to do so than St. Augustine's.


