FR. DAVID'S DAD JOKE OF THE WEEK

ST. AUGUSTINE REFLECTION

I love these readings for the first Sunday of Advent! I'm especially interested in the way that Christ and His nativity connect to the Old Testament readings from Jeremiah 33 and Psalm 25. The fulfillment of Jeremiah 33:15 is very clear: Jesus Christ is the "just shoot" of the house of David (see Matthew 1:1-17 or Luke 3:23-38). Jeremiah 33:16 is less clear for those thinking in a political or material way. Christ does not overthrow Rome or bring the Jewish people riches and power. However, the safety of Judah and Jerusalem that Christ brings is something far more valuable—it is safety from sin, and the security in a relationship with the only One who can redeem us.

When I was a student at the University of Notre Dame, one of my favorite Psalm settings in our Newman Hymnal was a version of Psalm 25. "To you, O Lord, I lift my soul." I think it is a beautiful prayer to entrust the formation of our soul to God. It is truly good to ask Him to make known to us His ways, teach us His paths, and guide us in His truth. The wise psalmist knows that we cannot find the good ways and paths on our own and has put his full trust in the kindness, goodness, and justice of the Lord. I think this psalm is particularly excellent for the beginning of the Advent season, because the culmination of the Advent season in the Nativity of Christ is fulfilling the psalmist's profound and admirable desire. Jesus Christ is the (literally) perfect teacher of God's paths and guide for God's truths. His life with us, from birth to crucifixion and resurrection to ascension, was the greatest lesson in the ways of the Lord. And this lesson starts from the very beginning, as the Son of God humbles Himself to be born in a manger as He takes on humanity.

One more very important reminder these readings give us for the Advent season comes from the end of the Gospel: "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life.....Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man." (Luke 21:34-36)

Although I'm not big on drunkenness or carousing, I have witnessed a temptation in my own life to become more focused on relaxation, good food, and celebration than I am focused on Christ during the Advent season. Additionally, over a break from school, it can be difficult to remain strong and vigilant in prayer, virtue, and the sacraments. I would encourage each of us to make prayer a priority as we approach the Christmas season, and to ask God to make known His ways of enjoying and celebrating the nativity of Jesus. Christ comes to fulfill our deepest desires, far beyond what any Christmas treat, gift, or party will ever be able to do.

Not only that, but the student center offers adoration in the Hurley Chapel AND we have access to Daily Mass, daily Adoration, Confession, and even spiritual direction. Whether you like it or not, opportunities for time with Jesus are thrown at you! I
