ST. AUGUSTINE REFLECTION

Imagine for a moment that you are a follower of Jesus of Nazareth in the first century AD. You've followed Him about as he travels from town to town preaching the Gospel. You've seen him feed thousands from five loaves of bread. You've seen Him heal and cast out demons. You've heard Him teach and preach and live life, and now He's making a long, rambling way to Jerusalem for the Passover (if you're having trouble imagining this, simply read the few chapters preceding today's Gospel). Now, you've been appointed one of the 72, tasked, as we hear today, with going out ahead of Jesus in pairs to announce the good news in all the places He intends to visit along the way to Jerusalem.

What are you feeling, as you put your-self in their shoes? Are you joyous, enthusiastic, confident in the success of the mission? If you are, you're a better disciple than I am. I, an anxious control freak, am already feeling my heart race. "You want me to go knock on strangers' doors, heal them, and tell them about the kingdom of God? And then if they brush me off as a crazy person, you want me to tell them that they'll be rejecting God and subjecting themselves to His disapproval? How on earth am I supposed to do that?"

"How am I supposed to..." is my question to God far too often in prayer. Maybe it's yours, too. "God, how am I supposed to find time for spiritual growth?" "How am I supposed to raise kids in the faith?" "How am I supposed to forgive this person who hurt me?"

The answer, as so often happens, is actually given here in anticipation of the question. Jesus says to the 72, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his har-

vest." (Lk 10:2, italics added). As much as I'd like to believe I'm in control, I'm not the master of the harvest. God is. God doesn't actually intend for us to figure it out on our own. What are we going to do about the fact that there's too few laborers? My mind is already spinning with solutions to that problem, but Jesus reminds us - you don't actually have to solve this on your own. Ask the one who is in charge.

The master of the harvest doesn't want his harvest to go to waste, so it goes without saying that, if he's going to send laborers, he is going to equip them for success. If it were up to me to spread the Gospel all alone, just because I thought it was a neat idea to knock on those doors, to heal the sick, to rebuke those who mock me -I would certainly fail. I'd fail before I even started. I don't think I'd have the courage to walk out my own door. But the Gospel isn't just a neat idea, and when God named me, called me, sent me, he didn't just say "Hey good luck, kid; hope you don't screw this up."

The Gospel is life changing. An encounter with the risen God is transformative. And God desires that in my transformation, I would cooperate with His work, speak His words, be His hands and feet. The 72 experience this in a powerful way, and we hear today that when they return, they're rejoicing. Jesus, knowing our human tendencies to put the focus on ourselves ("Look, I solved this problem!"), reminds them quickly of the cause for their joy. It should also be the cause of ours. "Do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."
