Lamica further stated, "The Good Samaritan Food Pantry will remain in its current location at 57 Rennie Street under the management of the parish."

Lamica stated that Malone Catholic Charities will retain services currently offered and staff is excited that the new space may provide opportunity to expand services to youth and seniors, as well as other services in Malone. The office will be relocated by the end of the year and the new location to be announced soon.
