

From Fr. Steve.....

Bishop LaValley will end the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass on the 6th of June 2021. Which means we as a faith community have some real work to do to encourage our fellow parishioners to join us. We will need to be warm and welcoming, this is not difficult for you from my experience.

As Catholic Christians, our grounding in the Eucharist makes our faith unique and vibrant, yet many of our parishioners have not received the Eucharist in over a year. This is not a spiritually healthy situation, which needs to be addressed by all of us. I know it is chiefly the responsibility of the clergy, the priest and deacons, however we need your help. St. André's Brothers and the Scripture Sisters are planning to assist us as we strive to get the word out. The word being that this faith community is strong and vibrant and it can be even better with everyone's participation.

Throughout the worst of the pandemic, we reached out to our brothers and sisters by providing Mass for the appropriate Sunday on Spectrum, and that will continue for those who are ill or homebound. We also did a live-stream of the 9:30 Sunday morning Mass from Notre Dame Church. We have reopened St. Helen's Church in Chasm Falls and cannot live-stream from that location. At the same time the number of people viewing the live-stream has decreased dramatically. However, the number of people actually attending Mass in person has dramatically increased. Those who have been fully vaccinated do not have to wear masks or socially distance, although they can if they choose.

REV. FERNANDO VALDEZ SOLOMON, JR.



Fr. Fernando will be welcomed to St. André Bessette Parish on June 16th. Here is a little background on Fr. Fernando. Fr. Fernando earned his bachelor's degree in philosophy and master's degree in divinity in the Philippines. For a period of time, he worked in ministry to the deaf and in prison ministry. He is fluent in several languages including English, Tagalog, Spanish and American Sign Language. After encountering the Diocese of Ogdens-

burg early in his time in the United States, Fr. Fernando Solomon has always hoped that he would be part of this Diocese. That hope became a reality nearly 10 years later, as Deacon Solomon, a transitional deacon seeking ordination to the priesthood, had been officially incardinated into the Diocese of Ogdensburg. After completing his seminary education in the Philippines, Fr. Solomon was ordained as a deacon in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois. To be incardinated into this diocese, Fr. Solomon had to obtain permission from the bishops of both dioceses. Fr. Solomon first visited the diocese not long after arriving in the United States from the Philippines in 2011 to serve with missionaries for a deaf apostolate. In 2012, he met some of the priests of this diocese, and that was the beginning of him getting to know the Diocese of Ogdensburg. Sometime around 2012, 2013, he inquired for the diocese and he was (in the United States) on a religious workers visa, which did not work out at that time because of immigration issues. Years later, Fr. Solomon found himself living in the Utica area with priest friends. He again thought of the Diocese of Ogdensburg. He started communicating with the Diocese and in February of 2020, the Diocese contacted him and asked him to come serve the Diocese, which he started on March 31st. Fr. Solomon has been serving this past year in the Catholic Communities of Crown Point, Moriah and Port Henry.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Over a year ago, on March 17, 2020, I announced that all public Masses were suspended in the Diocese of Ogdensburg due to the Coronavirus. The faithful were dispensed from their obligation to participate at Sunday Eucharist. After consultation with public health officials, certain protocols were established in our parishes and the public celebration of the Eucharist resumed. Our churches have proven to be among the safest places to come together, a great testament to the ongoing hard work of pastors, parish staffs and our parishioners. Our parishes have engaged in creative ways to foster worship during this health emergency. Live-streaming has permitted many of the faithful to watch the liturgy. As you know, while this has been a great benefit to so many, it can never replace our actual presence at Mass with our parish family.

The time has come for Catholics to return to public worship at Mass on Sundays. On June 6, the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, I reinstate the obligation to attend Sunday Mass in the Diocese of Ogdensburg. However, we remember that there are times when this obligation does not apply:

- If an individual struggles with serious health concerns or is physically or morally prevented from worshipping at Mass;
- If an individual, because of age or illness, believes that going into public places, including Sunday Mass, would place that person's health or that of their loved ones in serious peril; or
- If an individual is sick, has been in contact with someone who has been sick or is caring for a seriously ill person who requires their presence.

I urge our sisters and brothers who are unable to participate at Mass to make holy the Lord's Day by praying, reflecting on Sacred Scripture and performing works of charity. Why is the obligation lifted now? Things have changed since St. Patrick's Day 2020. A vaccination for the virus has been found to be effective, safe and available. Our protocols have enabled our churches to be safe places to gather. Certain restrictions remain in place, thus providing a measure of comfort for those who attend Mass.

The Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our Catholic faith. The celebration of the Mass is the center of the life of the Church. At every Mass Christ continually nourishes and forms His pilgrim Church as she journeys towards the Kingdom. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that "the principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus. While we each personally receive Holy Communion, it is not a private devotion. The reception of Holy Communion is an integral part of our worship as a community of faith. In receiving Holy Communion, we are united to Jesus and to one another."

Celebrating Mass takes us beyond a narrow concern for ourselves and moves us to promote the common good and to uphold the dignity of every human person. Tragically, even before live-streamed Masses, Catholics have been dramatically absent from Sunday Mass. With the lifting of this dispensation, we pray that more hearts will experience a renewed fervor and love for the Holy Eucharist and in keeping the Lord's Day every Sunday. We all need divine medicine and heavenly food for the soul—See you at Mass!

CEMETERY REGULATIONS

(St. Joseph, St. John Bosco, Notre Dame, St. Helen)

We want to remind everyone of the importance of following the rules and regulations at our cemeteries:

FENCES, LAWN BORDERS, ORNAMENTS, STATUES, GLASS ARTICLES, SHRUBS, OR BUSHES ARE NOT ALLOWED. Annual flowers are allowed to be placed adjacent to the stone. Artificial flowers are only allowed for two weeks prior and for two weeks after Memorial Day. They will be removed after that time. If you have any questions, please contact the office at 483-1300 during the hours of 9am to 4pm. The cemetery organization is not responsible for any lost or stolen items. Families of grave owners should be considerate of others. We ask that you not drive on the lawns. With the cooperation of all, each cemetery will continue to be a beautiful memorial to our deceased loved ones. Thank you for your cooperation!

Low gluten hosts are available at each of our churches. If you or a loved one require a low gluten host for medical reasons, please see the priest *at least 5 minutes before Mass* to make arrangements for Holy Communion.



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Steven Murray to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
