


Welcome to St. André's Parish!

From Fr. Steve.....

This Sunday is the great feast of Christ the King, the end of the Liturgical year. Many years ago when I was first here I went to Burger King and got crowns for all the children. I'm not sure if they have those anymore. It was kind of silly but it did get people's attention. That was the point after all, in our country we do not understand royalty. If you paid any attention to the death of Queen Elizabeth II, you might have noticed the great affection and esteem in which she was held by the English people. Some might say that had a great deal to do with her longevity. I guess my point is that Jesus Christ our King has been around for several millennium and perhaps we have gotten to used to his presence and action in our lives. Or maybe we do not recognize his real presence in the Church, the Scripture, the Priest (when he presides), and finally in the Eucharist, our most prominent experience of the real presence. However, many Catholic Christians doubt Christ's real presence in the Eucharist. This is something I find personally very upsetting and a real cause for genuine concern. The reason perhaps many do not practice their faith regularly.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Steven Murray to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
