




ADULT FAITH FORMA

RCIA – Next week, June 7, we will be doing a prayerful reading of the Scripture passages from Mass, with a focus on the Gospel of John 3:16-18.

Scripture and Religious Studies - Our next study is called "True Reformers." It is a 6-week study that will begin on June 1 for the Monday group and June 3 for the Wednesday morning group. When setting up your account, you will be asked if you are an individual, an organization/church, or an individual as part of a church. Choose the last option as part of a Church and input your St. Joseph in Marion, Iowa as your parish. This will link your account to St. Joseph and provide free access to FORMED content for you since we have a parish account.

Human Life Exalted

Jesus prayed on the night before he died, "Father, give me the glory I had with you before the world began." How is the glory he has in the Ascension different from the glory he had "before the world began?" It differs only in that now, he has it in a human nature. Our humanity has been taken to the heights of heaven, fulfilling the destiny God intended for human life from the beginning. Revelation 3:21 declares, "To the one who gains the victory, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne." God's plan for us is not just that we will gather around the throne or fall down before the throne, but that we will sit with him on the throne! This hope extended to the human family by the Gospel is directly contradicted when the same human beings destined for the heights of heaven are attacked by violence, degraded in their dignity, or put to death by things like abortion. The human nature Jesus brings to glory in the Ascension is the same human nature you and I share, and the same human nature that the babies in the womb share. Celebrating the Ascension in daily life means treating each human life as one destined to sit with Christ on his throne.

Parish Stewardship: Sharing One's Treasure

Your financial gifts to the parish have been fantastic especially during this unprecedented pandemic crisis. Thank you for your faith, generosity and care. Please continue what you have been doing.

We have an idea for you to consider. While you certainly may continue to give through your budget envelope, and we always will be grateful, we would be equally grateful if you were to choose to give in these ways:

- 1. By ACH-- Bank withdrawals can be made weekly, monthly or bi-monthly.
- 2. By Tithe.ly-- Debit or credit card offertory directly to the parish can be done at any time. A recurring option is available if desired.
- 3. By electronic check-- Request a check to be mailed to the parish from your banking institution weekly, monthly, or another timeframe. This is a touchless option but does require staff to record and deposit at the bank so not the top option.

We suggest these alternative ways to give in order to minimize or eliminate contact with paper as yet another way to protect the pastor and office staff from the spread of the Coronavirus. Perhaps this makes sense to you. If it does, please consider giving via the alternate means presented.

The Coronavirus has impacted our lives and exacted a heavy toll on our livelihoods, how we understand ourselves and live our daily lives. Before the virus impacted our country, it would have seemed inconceivable that our lives would change so significantly over the span of two months.

But, now we're coming back to church. It won't be the same as when we ceased celebrating public Masses in March. We are slowly reopening for Masses with other religious services and events to

follow. It is no coincidence that we are reopening on Pentecost as we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit given to the Church and we who are her members. Today is the birthday of the Church. We are celebrating the rebirth of our parish this weekend, the rising from the curtailment of public religious services. Jesus has always been with us and the Holy Spirit has been enlightening and guiding our way through the pandemic and up to this moment. Come Holy Spirit! Fill us with the joy of your love.

Routines Change but Jesus Remains: The Resumption of Public Masses at St. Joseph—Please find below some of the things you need to know in order to attend Mass. All of these procedures are established out of charity (love of God and neighbor) and the common good (for the good of all people). Our goals with these procedures are to open the church for you to worship God as a Eucharistic community, to offer the opportunity to receive the Eucharist, and to preserve the health and safety of all who are attending. Sometimes freedoms or that to which you are accustomed are sacrificed or modified because of love and the common good.

- ✓ You will need to reserve a space to attend Mass as there are 50 places available for families to sit. Please consult the parish website to learn how to do so at www.stjoesmarion.org.
 - ✓ Before leaving home, always go through this checklist:
 - o Are you exhibiting any symptoms of the Coronavirus? If you are, then don't attend Mass.
 - A temperature above 100.4 F
 - Cough or sore throat
 - Shortness of breath
 - Recent loss of smell or taste
 - Chills
 - New muscle aches
 - Gastrointestinal upset and diarrhea
 - Wash your hands
 - o Take your mask
 - Bring your ticket to Mass
 - o Take your hand sanitizer
 - ✓ When you arrive in the parking lot, stay in your car until you are notified that the church is open.
 - ✓ When notified, place your mask on and wait in the designated line, six feet apart from the next person, in order to enter through the main church doors.
 - ✓ If you DO NOT have a ticket, please wait by the light pole with the sign, "Standby" affixed to it. Those in the standby line will be accommodated if space is available.
 - ✓ When you've shown your ticket, the ambassadors will show you to your seat. Seating will be from the front to the back of the church. It is imperative that you follow instructions.
 - ✓ You will be instructed by an ambassador regarding how to go to communion.
 - o Only the consecrated host will be distributed.
 - o Communion will only be distributed in the hand.
 - Wear your mask to and from communion. Remove only a part of it to place the consecrated host in your mouth.
 - ✓ When Mass is completed, the ambassadors will show you how to exit the church through the door that is nearest to you. Please leave the church immediately.
 - ✓ After Mass, the church will be closed and sanitized.


