- 1. By ACH-- Bank withdrawals can be made weekly, monthly or bi-monthly.
- 2. By Tithe.ly-- Debit or credit card offertory directly to the parish can be done at any time. A recurring option is available if desired.
- 3. By electronic check-- Request a check to be mailed to the parish from your banking institution weekly, monthly, or another timeframe. This is a touchless option but does require staff to record and deposit at the bank so not the top option.

We suggest these alternative ways to give in order to minimize or eliminate contact with paper as yet another way to protect the pastor and office staff from the spread of the Coronavirus. Perhaps this makes sense to you. If it does, please consider giving via the alternate means presented.

The Sanctity of Human Life

"All the hairs of your head are counted...you are worth more than many sparrows." This assertion in today's Gospel (MT 10:30-31) forms the basis for how much God values human life. It is not just "living things" that God values, because he created them. Rather, it is human beings – worth more than other living beings – who are privileged to have a particular relationship with God. This "capacity for God" is what is meant by the "sanctity" of human life. There is a relationship opened up for us with the Creator – a relationship of which lower forms of life are not capable. We can know him, praise him, receive a share in his divine nature, and one day see him face to face. We were made for him, as St. Augustine said, and our hearts are restless until we rest in him. To acknowledge Jesus, is to bear witness to the care that he and the Father give to the smallest human lives, and the concern God has to preserve such life.

<u>Father's Day</u>—My dad would have been 95 next weekend. He died in 1980. I've had forty years to reflect upon his influence on my life. He was an impoverished child of the Great Depression who knew need, deprivation and the tragic loss of his dad at a young and delicate age. He and most of his brothers spent their adolescent years in a boy's home as wards of the state because their mother couldn't support them. He knew the school of hard knocks, defended our country and civilization as a member of America's Greatest Generation, and returned home to marry and have my brother and me.

For a dad whose father died early, he did a great job raising my brother and me with my mom. He taught thriftiness, honesty and to look someone in the eye and give them a firm handshake to tell them that you mean business. He always prioritized his family and our education. He was a good teacher, a great problem solver and excelled in math and electronics. I didn't inherit his math skills, but do like to figure things out and am an electronics geek of sorts.

Most of us know the formative effect of our fathers in our lives. They aren't perfect, and neither was my dad. There's lots to be thankful for in the ways our dads have been a part of our lives. Happy Father's Day to our dads, living or deceased. Make sure you tell your Dad why you are thankful for him today and that you love him. If deceased, pray in thanksgiving for the eternal repose of his soul.

<u>Public Weekday Mass</u>—is planned to resume on <u>June 23, 2020</u>, at 7:30 AM, Tuesdays through Fridays. Here are some helpful things to know:

- ✓ For the first few days, plan to enter the church ten minutes before Mass is to begin. The church will be locked until that time. Instructions will be given at the door.
- ✓ All the protocols, masks, public distancing, etc., will be observed as at the weekend Masses.
- ✓ To assist in sanitation after Mass, we will ask that attendees sit in the two sections off the main aisle. Most people did before the pandemic, so it likely won't be a difficult adjustment. Remember not to sit anywhere blue tape is found on the pew.
- ✓ For safety due to the aerosolized vapor in the air that can carry the Coronavirus, please plan to vacate the church by 8:30 AM.
- ✓ Morning Mass may be a good alternative for those who can't go to weekend Mass for various reasons.

As with the weekend Masses, we will evaluate how things are working and make adjustments accordingly. Routines change, but Jesus remains.

Public Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament—will resume on Monday, June 29, 2020, from 11 AM to Noon. The goal is to assess from there regarding a longer period of adoration during the day. Plans are being formed to open the church for private prayer as well. Details will have to be worked out. We want to keep you and those who use the church safe and also have some way of knowing where to sanitize which must occur on a daily basis. Please plan on reduced hours initially. The pandemic complicates matters and that is why we are phasing our opening so that we can plan things well and get things right. Routines change, but Jesus remains.

Out of the Office—I will be away from the parish from the afternoon of June 20th through June 24th. Fr. Sean Smith will be here to celebrate Mass and care for the priestly ministry of the parish. How about if I have Deacon Martin be his supervisor?




