**October Is Respect Life Month**—Prayer is the most powerful element in our efforts to bring about the respect of all life from conception to natural death, with abortion begin the preeminent concern. Please find below the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Life, which may be prayed anytime.

Mary, Mother of all Life, help us to respect human life from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death. R.

Mary, Mother of Compassion, You showed us how valuable a single life can be; Help us to guard and protect the lives of all people entrusted to our care. R.

Mary, Mother of the Child Jesus, with St. Joseph you formed the Holy Family. Guard and protect all families in this earthly life; R.

Mary, Mother Most Holy, You sanctified the vocation of motherhood; Pour out your heavenly aid on all mothers and help them to be holy. R.

Mary, Mother of Sorrows, Simeon's prophecy foretold that a sword of suffering would pierce your heart; Bring comfort and hope to all mothers who suffer over their children. R.

**November 1st is All Saints Day**—which will be celebrated on Saturday and Sunday next weekend. The weekend Mass schedule will remain the same.

**The Xavier Impact Fund Appeal**—began the parish phase last weekend. A letter about the appeal and pledge cards were sent to parishioners, although their delivery seems to have taken longer than anticipated. The fund is designed to help Xavier families with financial assistance, build the newly established teacher endowment and promote faith and academic advancement. Any monies raised over our parish goal will be returned to us. Please be generous for this worthy cause.

The archbishop offers the following guidance:

The Church will not tell people who to vote for, but will remind them of the moral duty to vote, and to vote conscientiously, offering points for consideration on key issues.

The Church won't endorse any political party, or any candidate by name. There will be no signs on parish property that endorse a political party or a candidate.

The Church won't state or imply that it's a sin to belong to one party or another, or to vote for one candidate or another. It isn't a sin to belong to either political party, or to vote for any one candidate, unless done so because they're pro-abortion, pro-death penalty, pro-euthanasia, racist, or harbor ill will towards immigrants and the poor.

It's unlikely that any party platform or political candidate is perfectly suitable from a Catholic perspective. In such a case, we are allowed to make the morally regrettable choice of not voting in a particular race. Or, for grave reasons, we may vote for the candidate we think will do the most good or the least harm.
