

<u>He Speaks with Authority</u>—is what the amazed people in the synagogue said of Jesus after he interpreted the scriptures for them and cast out the demon in a possessed man. What did they mean? Simply put, Jesus spoke from himself as God. There is no one greater or more authoritative than he is. God is God and we are not.

That sounds simple enough and may even seem to be blasé. So what? Jesus speaks from himself as God. But, this makes the fundamental difference in our lives. The word of God, holy scripture, spoken to us has definitive authority. God's is the first and last word. The same is true as God has spoken through the Tradition of the Church. God doesn't render opinions, but gives life through his word and speaks the word of life to us as we live our daily lives.

How do you relate to the word of God as it is spoken to you and our community? Is it one word among others? Is Jesus one public figure among many who renders an opinion for you to consider? Or, do you see Jesus for who he is and the word he speaks as coming from the very mouth of God with power, authority and effect? Today, people don't see Jesus for who he really is and recognize how he speaks. Interestingly, it was the demon in the man who not only knew who Jesus was, but was conformed to the authority and power of the word Jesus spoke. If the forces of evil know who Jesus is and obey him, shouldn't we, who are not among their minions, recognize Jesus for who he is and follow his authoritative word?

<u>St. Blaise Day</u>—is February 3rd. Throats are blessed that day, asking for the intercession of the saint to protect one from every disease of the throat and every other illness. While that blessing is always relevant, we especially see the need today to be protected from diseases that harm us like the Coronavirus. As in years past, the blessing will be given at the end of Mass at the time of the Final Blessing.

<u>Ash Wednesday</u>—is on February 17th. Here's the latest regarding what we are working on regarding Ash Wednesday:

- ➤ There will be three Masses: 7:00 AM, Noon and 5:30 PM
- ➤ Ticketing will be conducted for the Masses. Reservations will open at 8:00 AM on Monday, February 1st and close on Sunday, February 14th at Noon.
- Overflow seating will be in the church basement.
- ➤ A localized FM broadcast of the Mass will be offered for those who cannot be seated in the church or would like to attend but are not yet able to be in crowds.
- ➤ Those seated in the church basement or who are in their cars will be welcome to receive, at the appropriate time, ashes and Holy Communion inside of the church.
- ➤ As prescribed by Pope Francis, ashes will be distributed by sprinkling them on the top of one's head.
