

March 13-14, 2021 4th Sunday of Lent

Opening Song: Return to God Refrain:

Return to God with all your heart, the source of grace and mercy; come seek the tender faithfulness of God.

Now the time of grace has come, The day of salvation; come and learn now the way of our God. (refrain)

Reading I 2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled." In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

Brothers and sisters: God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ — by grace you have been saved —, raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so no one may boast.

For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.

Gospel Jn 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

<u>March 19 Is St. Joseph Day</u>—throughout the universal Church, we celebrate on this day the gift of St. Joseph, the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and earthly father of Jesus. As he protected Mary and Our Lord, he is rightly called the Protector of the Church.

The Solemnity of St. Joseph is also the patronal feast of our parish, meaning he is our patron for whom the parish is named. Even if it wasn't a solemnity, the highest ranking liturgical celebration

of our Church, we could take a day off of our Lenten penances—yes, even on a Friday—because our parish is named after him.

St. Joseph:

Pillar of families, pray for us.
Solace of the afflicted, pray for us.
Hope of the sick, pray for us.
Patron of the dying, pray for us.
Terror of demons, pray for us.
Protector of Holy Church, pray for us.

<u>Parish Lenten Observance</u>—Every Lent we are encouraged to engage in the spiritual practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Each individual can participate in these practices, but as the prophet Joel in the Old Testament reminds us, the community participates in them as well. To that end, we are offering ways that our parish might participate as a community in prayer, fasting and almsgiving. This Friday, please:

- Fast and pray for healing and unity in our nation.
- Give alms in support of the Churches of Marion Food Pantry and Metro Catholic Outreach. Food and monetary donations are appreciated.

Reservations for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday liturgies—are now being taken. If you don't have access to a computer or don't use one, please call the parish office, 377-4869, to make reservations.

<u>How to Attend Mass at St. Joseph</u>—We have opened a greater seating capacity for Mass attendance in the church with a livestreaming system established in the church hall. The plan is that we will seat people in the church first, and when it reaches capacity, then the church hall. Another way we are offering Mass attendance is in the parking lot via local broadcasting on FM 87.9. Those attending this way are welcome to enter the church to receive Holy Communion either in the back of the church or from the main aisle. This option is offered when no more seating is available in the church building or for folks who are not ready to gather in crowds due, for example, to preexisting conditions or other concerns about the virus.

<u>The Sacrament of Penance in the Cedar Rapids Deanery</u>—Like during Advent, the Cedar Rapids metro area parishes will be celebrating the Sacrament of Penance, through General Absolution and/or individual confessions, on the same days and at the same times during Lent. The schedule is on the front page of this bulletin. At St. Joseph, the Sacrament of Penance will also be celebrated on Saturdays from 2:30-3:30 PM throughout the Lenten season.
