

Reading I Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. <u>Sunday Mass Obligation</u>-- for the faithful of the Archdiocese of Dubuque will be reinstated the weekend of **June 5-6, 2021**, which coincides with the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

The Archbishop states that Catholics may be excused from the Sunday Mass obligation if they are frail from age or illness, or; caring for someone who is sick, homebound or an infant, or; if weather makes driving hazardous, or; work and Mass schedules conflict. Further, he says, if you would go to Mass but miss because of reasons outside of your control, then there is no sin in missing the Sunday obligation.

The duty given to the pastor by the Archbishop is to consult with parish staff and the Pastoral Council regarding revisions to be made with the parish pandemic protocols. He is to proceed cautiously with those revisions. You can read the Archbishop's statement here **dbqarch.org/sunday-opportunity**.

At St. Joseph, we have begun engaging in a gradual revision of the pandemic safety protocols and practices. Last weekend, we reintroduced:

- The singing of the Alleluia before the gospel.
- The singing of the Great Amen following the Doxology at the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer.
- The exchange of the Sign of Peace through a wave or nod of the head.

This week:

- We will begin using the pre-pandemic Holy Communion distribution lines.
- We will continue to phase in pre-pandemic duties of our Mass servers and they will be seated in the sanctuary.

<u>Ascension Thursday Celebrated on this Sunday</u>—This solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord into heaven has been transferred to the Sunday before Pentecost by most dioceses in the United States.

The Ascension is part of our paschal (Easter) faith. When Jesus completed his mission on earth, he ascended into heaven in his glorified body (the way he was and appeared after the resurrection) and is now seated at the right hand of his Father. At the end of time, he will come again to judge the living and the dead. Before ascending into heaven, Jesus commissioned the apostles to preach the gospel and baptize. The gift of the Holy Spirit was given after the Ascension to empower the Church and the apostles to teach, govern and sanctify in Jesus' name. That work continues today until Jesus' second coming at the end of time.
