



Middle School students participate in "minis" every Wednesday.


Minis are courses that range from sewing to cooking to life skills. It is a great way to expose students to non-academic activities that can be used in life.











<u>Palm Sunday</u>—begins the most solemn week of the liturgical year. During this liturgy, we joyfully welcome Christ into the Jerusalem, hailing him as king. Then, as the Passion is read, we make the case against Jesus and join the crowds demanding that Pilate put him to death. The drama of Christ's passion and death lays open the worst of humanity in its brokenness and sinfulness, thus exposing why Jesus was Incarnate and died on the cross. The love of God for his creation is revealed and expressed through Jesus' death. Let your

participation in Mass this weekend be not only through the liturgical words and prayers you will say and the ritual gestures you will do, but let this liturgy move you to silence to ponder in your depths the cross of Christ. Through Christ's agony on the cross which led to his death, we see the radiance of God's love for us. Without Jesus' death, we would be lost to sin and never reconciled with God.

The Liturgies for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday—

Here's what is important for you to know:

- We will have open seating throughout the church. There will not be a section for social distancing. Masks will not be required. Anyone may wear a mask if desired. Currently, the CDC has classified Linn County as being in a green zone (COVID-19 by County | CDC). Masks will only be recommended if the county is classified as a red zone.
- Overflow seating for Easter Sunday will be in the <u>church basement</u>.

Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum Schedule

Tuesday, April 12

• Chrism Mass, 2:00 PM, at St. Raphael, Dubuque.

Holy Thursday, April 14

 Mass of the Lord's Supper—7:00 PM. The Adoration Vigil of the Blessed Sacrament will follow the liturgy until 9:00 PM.

Good Friday, April 15

- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, 3:00 PM. This includes the Veneration of the Cross.
- This is a universal day of fasting and abstinence
 - Abstinence -- Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be eaten at all.
 - ♦ Fast -- Catholics over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. Food necessary for the taking of medications is certainly allowed.
