


Rite of Acceptance This Sunday
The initial inquiry (precatechumenate)
period for our group of inquirers will be
moving into the second stage, with our

first opportunity for unbaptized inquirers to go through the Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens, this **Sunday, November 20!**

The Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens (Rite of Acceptance) is the first of the "threshold rites" of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), and the first public ritual. In this rite, a change of identity takes place: those previously known as inquirers become catechumens (unbaptized). They are officially welcomed by the Church as disciples, members (albeit not yet full members) of the household of faith. The text calls this rite "the first consecration by the Church" of those seeking Christian initiation. They are literally marked with the cross of Christ as God's own. We invite you to take an active role in welcoming our Catechumens and to be models of faith and Christian charity for them.

We ask you to please continue praying for the catechumens: Lisa Tracy, Sawyer Wood and Hayden Becker, as they continue their conversion journey and for our RCIA team as we assist them in moving toward a closer relationship with God. We also have two adults joining us who are seeking Confirmation: Melissa Mikkola and Anna Shudzeka.



4 Great Things Area 4: Educating the Whole Child



The Solemnity of Christ, King of the Universe (Christ the King)—is celebrated this Sunday. The celebration was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 at the close of the Jubilee Year in response to the fall of various kingdoms after World War One, the growth of secular nationalism that filled the void and the rise of atheism.

Fr. Secular nationalism could establish the nation state above God, making it the source of all rights, governance and care of its citizens. God would take a minor if any role in any of this, much less to say that his sovereignty over the world could be denied. Factor in atheism, and the state would reign supreme without any acknowledgement of God who is the source of

power that a nation state might possess and the rights bestowed upon humanity.

This year, we reflect upon the establishment of Jesus' kingship by his death on the cross wherein sin is forgiven and death is conquered though his resurrection on the third day. Jesus' death on the cross is the ultimate expression of God's love for humanity and the world. The brokenness of our world, governmental and social structures is healed through his death and given new, redemptive life through his resurrection. Every knee, every civilization, government, culture and society is to bow at the name of Jesus. Indeed, this shall be done at the end of time. Anything less subjects the state, government and society to brokenness because of the deep wounds of Original Sin.

<u>The Season of Advent</u>—begins next weekend. There is a two-fold character to the season: (1) The preparation for the Second Coming of Jesus at the end of time, and; (2) The immediate preparation for Christmas. Both converge into the now. The first part of Advent is the former, while from about the Third Sunday of Advent, it is the latter. We wear purple vestments during the Sundays of Advent, except rose for the Third Sunday, because there is a penitential character to the season as well. You will and are encouraged to go to confession in preparation for the celebration of Christmas and to establish a regular habit to prepare your soul for the end of your earthly life which comes with death.

The season is rich in scriptural reflection upon Jesus and that piece of salvation history that led to his incarnation and birth. Even though this year we will observe the longest Advent that is possible, the season slips away quickly because of our preoccupations with the things of this world. Let that be a sign and a warning that Christ will come at the end of time when you least expect him. That behooves you to prepare for his coming now and the season of Advent offers superb spiritual assistance to do so.
