





<u>The Good Shepherd</u>—Today is called Good Shepherd Sunday. The gospel this weekend always comes from a section wherein Jesus speaks of himself as the shepherd who leads and guides his sheep (us). The sheep know Jesus' voice and they follow it as he protects and leads them to green pastures.

St. Peter was commissioned by Jesus to be the shepherd of his sheep after our Lord ascended into heaven. The famous conversation between Jesus and Peter in John 21, is when Jesus called Peter to feed, lead, guide and teach his flock. Peter was to become the

Vicar of Christ, the first pope in a long line of successors who would shepherd the Church and God's people on Jesus' behalf. The pope is to be subject to Christ, listen to his voice and be faithful to what Christ taught. When the pope speaks, it is to be the voice of Christ because he knows and obeys it. When he teaches, it is to be what Christ taught. When he acts, it is to be how Christ acted, and when he leads, it is in imitation of the Good Shepherd.

The pope, the Holy Father of our Church, is given by God the authority to appoint bishops to lead dioceses throughout the world, known of as local churches. The Holy Father may have assistance in his choices, but he alone creates and appoints bishops. That is what he will do for us when he appoints the new Archbishop of Dubuque. During this time when the bishop's chair in Dubuque is vacant, please pray for the Holy Father that the Holy Spirit will guide him to the best choice for our new archbishop. And, may it be soon so that we may benefit from and enjoy the leadership of a new shepherd of our local church.

<u>Distribution of the Precious Blood during Weekend Masses</u>—The celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday offered the perfect context to offer communion under both kinds, that is, the consecrated host and wine.

The reintroduction of the distribution of the Precious Blood was well received. As such, and following reflection with the Liturgy Committee of our parish, we will resume distributing the Precious Blood at the weekend Masses starting on Pentecost Sunday (May 27-28). We will distribute from two chalices and add more if needed.

This represents an expansion of the ministry of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion since we discontinued distributing the Precious Blood when the pandemic began. We will need to refresh the ranks of Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist in order for the distribution of the Precious Blood to be possible at every weekend Mass. <u>First Holy Communion</u>—Welcome to family members, friends, visitors and parishioners who have joined us for the celebration of First Holy Communion this weekend.

Let that invitation resound through the rest of your lives by way of the testimony you give regarding the beauty of the Catholic faith, to the Most Holy Eucharist and a frequent reception of Holy Communion.
