

John also writes; "that the world cannot accept the Spirit of Truth". The reason is that society today seems more concerned with material realities, things that can be seen and quantified. Consider discussing with your spouse how you utilize your material goods. Is the focus on these things to the extent such that it causes you to neglect others? Is some reprioritization needed? Pray with each other for the Spirit to show you how to use your assets to the benefit of others.





Mother's Day—I shared last year that my perspective about Mother's Day has changed since my mother's death almost two years ago. I still observe the day, but now more prayerfully as I pray that she rest eternally with God in heaven. It's a way that I share my love for my mother, with whom I am united in the love of Christ.

Living or deceased, your mother has a profound place in your life. Following your conception, she carried you in the intimacy of her womb for nine months before you were born. Afterwards, she nursed and cared for you. These basic moments form the foundation of your life.

Realizing this, Mother's Day offers you a reminder and a motivation to pray for your mother as an act of thanksgiving and intercession for her before God. Your love for, presence with and acknowledgement of your mother is important and is wrapped together through prayer into a beautiful spiritual bouquet you present to your mother today and throughout the year. Don't forget to tell your mother that you love her and tell God that you love her through your prayers for her.

<u>Ascension Thursday</u>—In many dioceses in the United States, the celebration of the Ascension of Jesus into heaven is transferred from a Thursday to the following Sunday. That is what happens in the archdiocese. We won't celebrate the ascension on the 18th of this month, forty days after Jesus rose from the dead, but rather on the 21st. Pentecost Sunday will follow the next weekend.

<u>Deacon Casey Flack</u>—who did his diaconal internship with us last summer, will be ordained to the priesthood at St. Raphael Cathedral, Dubuque, with his classmate Deacon Jeff Frieden, on May 27th, at 10:00 AM. Fr. Flack will be at St. Joseph the weekend of June 17-18, to celebrate all the Masses with us. Please make an effort to be present at one of the Masses that weekend to celebrate his ordination, as a show of support to him and to encourage others in our parish to answer God's call to the priesthood.
