



The Sisters of St. Francis of Dubuque need volunteers for service trip on **July 22-August 1**, **2024**. The team will help make potable water accessible to people in the rural village of Lavatorio, Yarula, La Paz. Team members must be 21 years old (or 16+ if traveling with a parent/guardian); capable of physical work at high altitudes; and willing to participate fully in daily work, prayer, and team building. Must have a passport that will still be valid at least 6 months after the end of the trip. Travel insurance and appropriate vaccines highly recommended. Rite of Christian Initiation

The third step of the RCIA is a time for spiritual purification and enlightenment. It spans the season of Lent and culminates at the Easter Vigil when those to be initiated are baptized (if not already baptized), confirmed and share in the Eucharist for the first time. Lent is an especially appropriate time for this final step of reflection and examination of one's motivation. The season of Lent is like a spiritual retreat calling all of us to a renewal of heart and recommitment to our baptismal promises. Once again, we pledge ourselves to a gospel way of living, to discipleship of Jesus Christ, and to witnessing his message to all whom we meet.

The period of Purification and Enlightenment starts on the first Sunday of Lent, February 17, and ends with Easter Vigil. This year the archdiocesan Rite of Election, which marks the beginning of this period, will be held at 2:30 PM in the afternoon this Sunday, February 17 at the Cathedral of St. Raphael, Dubuque. Please keep our catechumens and candidates in your prayers as they enter this final period of preparation.



"He remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan" (Mk 1:13).

While Mark's gospel does not include the details of how the devil tempted Jesus during these 40 days, we learn more from Matthew. In his depiction, when the devil

tempts Jesus for the third time, the devil has realized the divinity of Christ's humanity, how Jesus was more than human. The devil's lame attempt to play into that was to offer Jesus "all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence" (MT 4:8) (or glory). Glory is the biblical term for a manifestation of splendor or wealth. In this case, it is the allurement to prefer power and wealth to the fidelity of God's love. This temptation represents a desire for power and rule; an attachment to material possessions and wealth. The building of one's pride and ego. Our response to a temptation for accumulating possessions and wealth, should be as Jesus instructed: "the Lord thy God shall we worship and Him alone we shall serve" (MT 4:10). May God's love for us be reflected in your love as a couple.




Lenten Encounter Night





Services We Provide

Under the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Medicaid Intellectually Disabled (ID) waiver, we provide the following Supported Community Living Services (SCL):

- 24-hour daily supports in residential homes where 3-5 individuals live.
- Social, recreational, and sensory supports are provided at our centers.

Supports are provided in Cedar Rapids, Hiawatha and Marion.

Who We Are

We are a local, private, non-profit 501c3 agency founded in 1977 by the **Knights of Columbus**.



Who We Support

Discovery Living provides services to adults (age 18 and older) with intellectual disabilities. We strive to be a provider for life, and have served many people for more than 30 years, adapting homes and vehicles as members' needs change over the course of their lives.



Most of our income comes from lowa Medicaid Enterprise to support the daily care and services we provide to adults in our programs. Iowa Medicaid, however, does not reimburse us for key expenses that are critical to our support services, including:

- Home purchases and modifications - We own over 25 homes, which we modify and adapt with hard surface flooring, ramps, railings, grab bars, lifts, egress windows, and other needed adaptations.
- Vehicle purchases and modifications – We own 50 vehicles that we purchase and modify to ensure that individuals can fully access their community.
- Adaptive equipment for communication, eating, bathing, and mobility.

Beautification Symbolism Part 5



In this week's installment on the artistry and symbolism of our Church Beautification effort, we'll continue to look at the wall of the Sanctuary. For this week, we'll focus on the lower portion of center mural surrounding the Tabernacle. The top picture allows us to see the detail of the mural. The lower picture provides an overall view of the sanctuary showing the centralized Tabernacle placement.





On either side of the Tabernacle, we see two twisted tree structures. Each has grown upwards and includes a branch that grows toward the Tabernacle. These are grapevines, full of leaves and grapes. The grapes represent the wine that, once consecrated, becomes the Blood of Christ. Towards the center, there are also stalks of wheat. These represent the bread that, once consecrated, becomes the Body of Christ. These both surround the tabernacle in which the Most Holy Eucharist is reserved.

From Holy Scripture we have the following references to wheat and vineyards

John 12:23-26

Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me.

John 15:1-2,5

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing.



Transubstantiation is the terminology used to describe the change of the bread and wine into the Precious Body and Blood of Christ. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

1376 The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring: "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called **transubstantiation**."

1377 The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. **Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species** and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ.

Catechism 1379 describes the importance of the Tabernacle and its placement in our church.

1379 The tabernacle was first intended for the reservation of the Eucharist in a worthy place so that it could be brought to the sick and those absent outside of Mass. As faith in the real presence of Christ in his Eucharist deepened, the Church became conscious of the meaning of silent adoration of the Lord present under the Eucharistic species. It is for this reason that the tabernacle should be located in an especially worthy place in the church and should be constructed in such a way that it emphasizes and manifests the truth of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

As we recognize the true presence of Christ in Precious Body and Blood, let us close with this Prayer from Eucharistic Adoration:

Benediction - Closing Prayer

O God who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruit of your redemption.

Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God forever and ever. Amen.
