St. Martin's First Corpus Christi Procession Today

It's finally here! Today's the day--our Corpus Christi procession. Instructions will be explained inside the church after the 12:15 PM mass (approximately 1:15 PM). Our hospitality ministers will distribute programs so everyone can participate in the prayers and hymns.

After brief instructions, we will file out so that people can get lined up. The Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus will lead our procession. Fr. Sy will carry our Lord in the monstrance under the baldachin (canopy). The congregation will follow.

Some parking spaces will be blocked off, so come earlier if possible.

Moments of Mercy

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, the Lectionary's Year of Luke presents a Gospel in which Jesus, who has welcomed, taught, healed, and shown God's mercy to the multitude, refuses the Twelve's demand to dismiss the crowd before him. Instead, he says, "Give them some food yourselves" (Luke 9:13). In Jesus' hands, what little the Twelve has feeds five thousand ("men," and probably as many women and children), leaving twelve baskets so the Twelve can continue Jesus' ministry of mercy. Pope Francis has asked how we celebrate and live the Eucharist. Do we keep it to ourselves? Or do we "commune" not only with Jesus but with the multitude whom Jesus has given us to cherish? Entrusted to Jesus and shared with others, our limited resources can go a long way. Recognizing Jesus in the Eucharist demands that we recognize Jesus also in the hungry crowd. Adoring Jesus present in the Eucharist requires that we serve Jesus present in our neighbor.

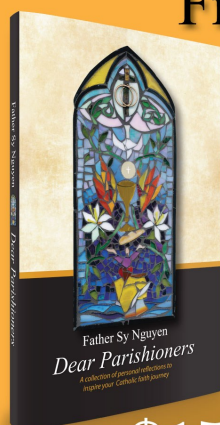
Altar Server of the Month April

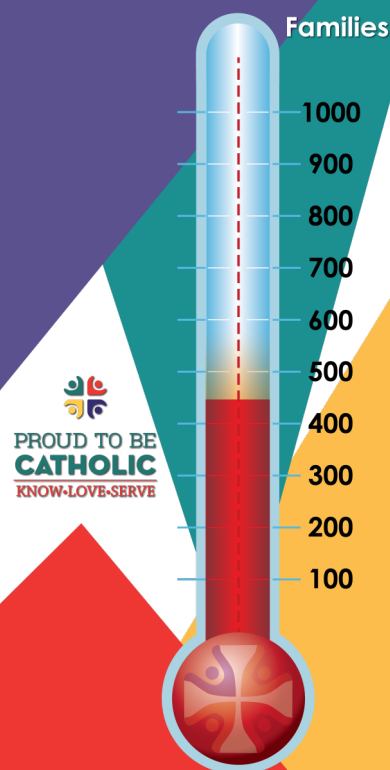

Discussing: "Faith Taking Shape: Early Christianity and the Arts" In light of the spectacular historical contributions of Christianity to Western Art, one might suppose that glorious religious art would somehow be inevitable. But given the Old Testament Biblical prohibition of the creation of graven images, and early classical philosophical reservations, it was by no means likely that Christianity would develop any art at all. Aside from simple early Christian symbols found in the catacombs, it wasn't until Emperor Constantine's Edict of Milan in 313 AD that gave legal status to Christianity and allowed for large church structures and shrines to come into being, that powerful arguments began to build for and against the creation and display of Christian arts. Between 300 and 1000 AD, Christian theologians developed a special vocabulary and conceptual framework for talking about God. In those same centuries, as Christian art developed and spread, Christians also learned how to talk about art. There are surprises and ironies in these two parallel developments. This presentation will explore how and why distinctive Christian art emerged.
