

From Our Parochial Vicar Father Nicolaus Thai

Perhaps the absence of the singing of the Gloria during the season of Advent (except for solemnities) might not be too noticeable this year, given the short duration of the season, with the 4th Sunday Mass followed immediately by the celebrations of Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses. This absence might give the impression that the Mass is shortened.

The Gloria is "a most ancient and venerable hymn by which the Church, gathered in the Holy Spirit, glorifies and entreats God the Father and the Lamb." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, n. 53) Its lyrics are rooted in and inspired by the Sacred Scriptures, with the first words, "Glory to God in the highest," taken from the praise of the multitude of angels offered to God at the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ, "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." (Luke 2:13-14, New American Bible version) Hence, the Gloria can be referred to as the hymn of

the angels. In singing, or even reciting, this joyful, ancient, prayerful song to God, the Mass-goer join with the angels praise, bless, adore, and glorify God and thank God for showing him His glory of the Holy Trinity: His Only Begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, through Whom God the Father reveals, Jesus Christ's redemption of mankind by taking sins away and ascension into heaven, and the Holy Spirit.

That the Gloria is not sung at Sunday Masses during Advent (the season to prepare for the coming of Jesus Christ, commemorated at Christmas and anticipated at the end of time and also in words and Sacraments) creates a missing part from the usual, joyful spirit of the Mass on the Day of the Lord and, in doing so, reminds the Mass-goer to more conscientiously, once again welcome Jesus Christ and what He accomplished objectively and continues to do so subjectively in them, as the Gloria praises.

San Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin

Feast Day—Dec 9

Juan Diego was born in 1474 with the name "Cuauhtlatoatzin" ("the talking eagle") in Cuautlitlan, today part of Mexico City, Mexico. He was a gifted member of the Chichimeca people, one of the more culturally advanced groups living in the Anahuac Valley. On Dec 9, 1531, when Juan Diego was on his

way to morning mass, the Blessed Mother appeared to him on Tepeyac Hill, the outskirts of what is now Mexico City. She asked him to go to the Bishop to request in her name that a shrine be built in Tepevac, where she promised to pour her graces upon those who invoke Her. The Bishop who did not believe him, asked for a sign to prove that the apparition was true. On Dec 12, Juan Diego returned to Tepeyac. Here, the Blessed Mother told him to climb the hill and to pick the flowers that he would find in bloom. He obeyed and although it was wintertime, he found roses flowering. He gathered the flowers and took them to Our Lady who carefully placed them in his tilma and told him to take them to the Bishop as "proof." When he unfolded the tilma before the Bishop, roses cascaded from his tilma, and an "Icon" of Our Lady of Guadalupe was miraculously impressed on the cloth, bringing the Bishop to his knees. Within 2 weeks of the miracle, Bishop Zumarraga ordered a Shrine to be built where the Virgin Mary had appeared. San Juan Diego died May 30, 1548 and was buried in the first chapel dedicated to the Virgin of Guadalupe. He was beatified on May 6, 1990, and canonized on July 31, 2002 by Pope John Paul II in the Basilica of Santa



Saint Stephen Feast Day—Dec 26

Maria di Guadalupe, Mexico City. San Juan Diego, Pray for us.

St. Stephen was born in Tarsus, a major city in eastern Cilicia in 5 AD. Died—36 AD; Jerusalem. The name Stephen is Greek and according to Acts 6, he was a foreign born Jew or a Hellenist who spoke Greek. St. Stephen is traditionally venerated as the protomartyr or first martyr of Christianity. He lived an exemplary

life as one of the seven deacons appointed by the Apostles to carry out charitable acts to the poor. His defense of the faith before the rabbinic court enraged his Jewish audience, and he was taken out of the city and stoned to death. His final words, a prayer of forgiveness for his attackers (Acts of the Apostles 7:60) "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit. Lord, do not hold this sin against them," echo those of Jesus on the cross (Luke 23:34). Following those words, Stephen died, in the Lord. He is often represented carrying a martyr's palm and a pile of rocks or with rocks on his head, symbolic of his martyrdom by being stoned to death. He is the patron saint of deacons and stonemasons. St. Stephen, pray for us.

That means, for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, you can go to any Mass between 4pm on Saturday, December 23 and 11:59pm on Sunday, December 24. For Christmas, you can go to any Mass between 4pm on Sunday, December 24 and 11:59pm on Monday, December 25.



Monsignor's Corner

Planter/Bollard Project

As I previously communicated, St. Martin de Porres applied for and was awarded a CalOES (California Governor's Office of Emergency Services) Grant to be used to increase the safety and security of our parish. In order to better protect parishioners in gathering areas on the parish property from any accidental or intentional motor vehicle intrusion, part of the grant money will be used to install structural planters that will be anchored into the ground. These planters will be three feet tall and designed to match the existing structure. Where possible these planters will be located in existing ground-level planter areas. Construction will occur during the First Quarter of 2024. I am grateful to those on the safety team who are handling the many details involved with this project.
