

Where is your soul at rest?

Saint Augustine wrote in his Confessions, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You." This speaks to the very nature of how we are wired. We chase "success" in so many ways, only to find out that the world's definitions leave us wanting. We climb ladders, only to find out that they are leaned against the wrong buildings.

True satisfaction, deep abiding joy, lasting meaning comes from being aligned with the core purpose of our existence. It comes when we embrace our true identity as sons and daughters of God, and when we let God's love flow through us and into the lives of others. Being conduits of Abba's love into the world is as good as it gets.

As we celebrate the last Sunday of Lent before Palm Sunday, we rapidly approach Holy Week, the culmination of our faith as Catholics. The theme of *renewal* is coursing through our readings today. God renewing His covenant in the first reading from Jeramiah, this time "placing it within us and writing it on our hearts." The very nature of how we are wired.

The psalm asks God to renew our hearts, to give us a clean heart. And our Gospel from John concludes with Jesus stating that He will draw everyone to Himself. For those attending 5:30pm Sunday Mass this weekend, the Gospel from Cycle A (for the Scrutiny) points to the ultimate renewal – Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead.

Today is a good day for each of us to ask ourselves "What needs to be renewed in me?" Where am I on the hamster wheel of life, running hard and getting nowhere? Where am I looking for love (or success) in all the wrong places? Where do I know better, because God's law is written on my heart? And I will not rest, until I rest in Him!

FEAST OF DIVINE Mercy Sunday April 7, 2024 Holy Hour 3 - 4pm St. Martin Church

Eucharistic Adoration, Benediction, Divine Mercy Chaplet and Veneration of St. Faustina Relic

Divine Mercy Sunday was established by St. Pope John Paul II in the year 2000.

- Free 8 x 10 Blessed image of Divine Mercy
- Refreshments will be served following the Holy Hour

St. Faustina recorded Jesus' promise in her diary. "I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls who go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy" (Diary 1109)... "Complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (Diary 699).

How do we prepare as a parish to celebrate this Feast?

- Pray the 9-Day Divine Mercy Novena. It begins Good Friday, March 29, and ends April 6. This powerful 5-minute prayer, given to St. Faustina by Jesus to pray for God's Mercy, is most powerful when prayed at the 3pm Hour of Mercy. We pray it in the Church daily at 3pm. You can also pray at home with your family. Jesus asks us to pray the Chaplet for the sick, the suffering, and the dying. You will find Divine Mercy prayer brochures in the Church vestibule.
- Make the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Tuesday, April 2 at 7pm, Saturday, April 6 at 4pm, or some time near the Feast Day.
- Attend Mass on Divine Mercy Sunday, receive Holy Communion, pray for the Pope's intentions and perform a Spiritual or Corporal Work of Mercy.
- Attend Eucharistic Adoration at 3pm Holy Hour on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 7 at St. Martin de Porres!

Receive a Plenary Indulgence (remission of temporal punishment due to confessed sin) on this great Feast.



Why do parishes have the Blessed Sacrament in a separate room?

Answer:

While many Catholics of a certain age have memories of the Blessed Sacrament being housed in the tabernacle on the high altar of the church, many parishes in the decades since the Second Vatican Council have chosen to build a separate space — a reservation chapel — where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. Although this practice is not universal, it is in keeping with the guidance offered by the US Bishops in their document Built of Living Stones (see nos 77-78). The goal is to create a space that is separated from the nave and sanctuary, but which is "integrally connected with the church" which can foster "reverence and can provide the quiet and focus needed for personal prayer." This can be especially important for communities that have continuous eucharistic adoration, allowing people to come and pray in a space separate from the normal activities of parish life.


The practice of reserving the Eucharist in a separate space — or in a dignified location away from the altar where Mass is celebrated — is that it emphasizes the importance of the liturgy itself, which is the "source and summit" of the life of the Church.

As with many things in the Church, the practice of placing the tabernacle in the sanctuary or in a separate chapel is not universal (as can be seen in visits to historic churches in Rome and other places). The important thing is that as communities question where to place the tabernacle, they listen to the voice of the Church, explore the ancient and varied liturgical tradition of the Church, consider the needs and life of the community, and also take into account the architecture and limits of the spaces they might already have.


