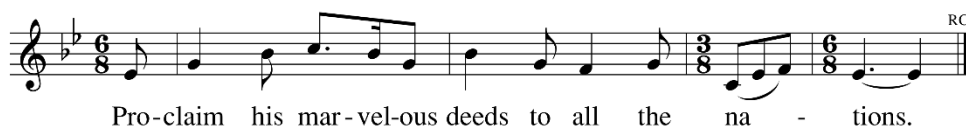
1st Reading
