

#### **Psalmody**

All are invited to join the singing of the psalms. Psalm verses will alternate between women and men.

Antiphon I– Cantor the first time, then all; repeat antiphon after psalm.

Psalm 127 – Apart from God our labors are worthless *You are God's building (1 Corinthians 3:9).* 



II – Lower Voices


- I Let us give thanks to the **Fa**ther for having made *you* **wor**thy to share the **lot** of the saints *in* **light**.

- I He is the image of the invisible God,
  the first-born of *all* creatures.
  In him everything in heaven and on earth was created,
  things visible and *invisible*.
- II All were created through him;all were created for him.He is before all else that is.In him everything continues in being.
- I It is he who is head of the body, the **church**! he who is the *begin*ning, the first-born of the **dead**, so that primacy may be his *in* **ev**erything.
- II It pleased God to make absolute fullness reside in **him** and, by means of him, to reconcile everything in *his* **person**, both on earth and in the **heav**ens, making peace through the blood of *his* **cross**.




Reading Hebrews 7:24-27

Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away. Therefore he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he forever lives to make intercession for them. It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself.

All observe a moment of silence following the reading.

All sing the Magnificat together.

My + soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord \*, my spirit rejoices in *God my* Savior for he has *looked with* favor \* on his *lowly* servant.

From this day all *generations* \* will *call me* **blessed**: the Almighty has done great *things for* **me**, \* and holy *is his* **Name**.

He has mercy on *those who* **fear** him \* in every *generation*.

He has shown the strength *of his* **arm**, \* he has scattered the proud in *their conceit*.

He has cast down the mighty *from their* **thrones**, \* and has lifted *up the* **lowly**.

He has filled the hungry *with good* **things**, \* and the rich he has sent *away* **empty**.

He has come to the help of his *servant* **Israel** \* for he has remembered his promise of **mercy**,

the promise he made *to our* **fathers**, \* to Abraham and his child*ren for* **ever**.

Glory to the Father, and to the **Son**, and to the *Holy* **Spirit**As it was in the beginning, is **now**, and will be forever, Amen.

All repeat the antiphon.

*Leader:* Christ our Savior, light of the world, you have called creation from death to life, may your light shine for ever on our departed brothers and sisters.

All: Lord Jesus, you live for ever; hear our prayer.
