# Ordinary Time "The No Reason Season"

Ordinary Time, the longest season of the church year, fills the weeks "which do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ." It's the no-particular-reason season. Christmas Time honors the birth of Christ. Easter Time rejoices in the resurrection. Ordinary Time is devoted to the mystery of Christ is all its aspects.

The number of the weeks of Ordinary Time replaces the old counting of weeks "after Epiphany" and "after Pentecost." The old calendar suggested that Pentecost ran for six months. The new calendar gives Pentecost a day. Then we return to Ordinary Time.

At first glance the principles of Ordinary Time seem basic enough. Start counting the weeks after Christmas Time. Break for Lent and Easter. Resume after Pentecost and keep counting till Advent. Basically, that's how it works. But we have a few quirks.

For example, there is no "First Sunday in Ordinary Time" however, there is a first week. Usually, Christmas Time ends on a Sunday with the Baptism of the Lord. The lectionary also calls it the First Sunday in Ordinary Time, but is part of the Christmas Time. (Some years the Baptism of the Lord falls on a Monday, but that's another story. Ordinary Time gets underway on a weekday. When the next Sunday rolls around we start week two.

On the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, we see the last of Ordinary Time until after Pentecost. Even then, it emerges only on weekdays. Trinity Sunday always follows Pentecost Sunday, and the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord comes the next Sunday in the United States. (In countries where this solemnity is a holy day, it falls on a Thursday.) So when the numbered Sundays in Ordinary Time return in summer, we start out a little higher than we left off.

Sometimes we skip one or two entire weeks of Ordinary Time during the Easer break. We want to close the Sundays of the year with Christ the King, one week before Advent. Christ the King always falls on the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time. So, we determine the week number after Pentecost not based on where we left off before Lent but counting backwards from Christ the King. One or two weeks may disappear, but Ordinary Time still serve the complete mystery of Christ.

**DID YOU KNOW?** Kentucky now makes available regular issue license plates for your car with the inscription "In God We Trust"? Take your current license plate to the County Clerk's office ANYTIME along with your registration certificate. They will exchange it for the new plate, with a replacement expirtation sticker for \$3. There is NO CHARGE to exchange the plate when renewing your tag. This inexpensive or free exchange is for regular issue license plates only. Specialty plates require a different process. SCOUTING EMBLEM WORKSHOP: The Catholic Committee on Scouting (CCS) will hold a series of classes for Boy Scouts and Venturers who wish to earn the Pope Pius XII Religious Emblem. The first meeting will be held on Sunday, July 13, 6:30 PM (after the 5:30 PM Mass), at Mary Queen of the Holy Rosary Education Life Center, in the Ministry Meeting Room (the door to this room is behind the outdoor statue of the Blessed Mother). The Pope Pius XII emblem is Catholic Scouting's church-related ministries and vocation program. The classes will discuss the various life choices (single, married, religious, ordained), occupations, and ministries within the Church as calls from God. The program includes youth led discussions on current issues facing the church and society, which are normally included as part of a Pius XII retreat or day of recollection. To be eligible, the participant must be a registered Boy Scout or Venture Crew Member of the Catholic Faith. Scouts/Venturers from all troops are welcome. The program is designed for 15 - 16 year olds, but all registered Venturers (before their 21st birthday) and Boy Scouts (before their 18th birthday) are eligible. 
# COMMUNION CALLS AND HOSPITAL VISITS

# **Catechist Certification**

- Catechists, please make sure your portfolios are in order. We will be paid a visit by the diocese in a few weeks to look at your portfolios and help you make sure everything is in order and on course. Laura will be collecting your binders in June and return them following their review.
- Mark your calendars for: Make-up Orientation August 30th, 2014. Session 3 October 25th, 2014 and Session 4 April 25th, 2015.
- Good Shepherd will be the location for the diocese's Catechist Certification in Spanish beginning Saturday, September 7<sup>th</sup> for Orientation. Session 1 will be October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2014, and Session 2 will be March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2015—in Spanish.

### **Sacramental Preparation**

**Baptism:** Preparation for parents and the godparents is necessary. Please remember that godparents should be selected who are firm believers and representatives of a Roman Catholic Christian community, the Church. They must be ready to help the newly baptized—child or adult—on the road of Christian life, (CCC 1255). Being a godparent is a ministry, not simply an honor, and is ideally a lifelong commitment.

**First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist:** Candidates must have completed at least one year of religious education and formation the year prior to being prepared for the sacraments the following year. The traditional age is the second grade.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must have completed at least one year of religious education and formation before being prepared for the sacrament the following year—at Good Shepherd, this is participation in our Youth Group program. The traditional age for Confirmation at Good Shepherd is ninth grade. Please remember that a sponsor should be selected who is a firm believer and representative of a Roman Catholic Christian community, the Church (CCC 1311). The sponsor traditionally is one of the Confirmand's godparents, but often that is not possible particularly because of distance. A sponsor should be someone the Confirmand trusts, someone whose faith they admire, and someone who will speak openly about their Catholic faith. Being a sponsor is a ministry, not simply an honor, and is ideally a lifelong commitment.

We have a lot of people and lots of children and we need some basic supplies. I am pasting below our current needs list, but I am also attaching it for you to print off and post at your work, churches, organizations, etc. We are getting very low or we are completely out of the top 7-8 items. Additionally, please feel free to forward this to people on your contact list.

Toilet Paper, Paper Towels, Laundry Detergent - Regular and Fragrance Free, Tall Kitchen Trash Bags, Fabric Softener, Bleach , Shampoo and Conditioner, Baby Wipes and Diapers, Hanging File Folders, Manila Folders, Tape Dispenser and Tape, Large Corkboard (at least 3'x4' or larger), Plastic Storage Bins – medium to larger size, 3-hole folders with pockets on one or both sides (prefer a shade of purple), Copy paper ,Some basic tools (hammer, screw drivers, pliers, etc.) (gently used is fine) ,Printer Ink: HP 60 (Black and Color), Plungers - 2, Light bulbs , Wal-Mart , Kroger, or Other Gift Cards (these are used for specific needs on a case by case basis or for emergency needs)


