- How was my life, and the lives of all, changed on January 22<sup>nd</sup>, 1973?
- Is there a correlation between the violence and disregard for human life in our country today and the Supreme Court's decision 44 years ago?

- Do I recognize God's gift of dignity in myself? Do I know God's mercy, forgiveness, His desire for me to embrace His love? Do I recognize and share the same with others?
- Two weeks ago at Mass we celebrated the Magis' encounter with the Christ Child. After the encounter the Magi chose a different path, Matthew 2:12. Does my path reflect the same encounter?

**From the 9 Days for Life Novena – 2017:** Today, on this 44th anniversary of Roe v. Wade, we consider the past four decades in which our society has legally permitted abortion. Since that tragic decision, many children's lives have been lost, and many suffer that loss—often in silence. Yet God's greatest desire is to forgive. No matter how far we have each strayed from his side, he says to us, "Don't be afraid. Draw close to my heart."

"In the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, also called confession, we meet the Lord, who wants to grant forgiveness and the grace to live a renewed life in him. ... We bishops and priests are eager to help you if you experience difficulty, hesitation, or uncertainty about approaching the Lord in this sacrament. If you have not received this healing sacrament in a long time, we are ready to welcome you."

**LET US REMEMBER :** As we remember Roe vs Wade, the Supreme Court decision in 1973 that legalized abortion in our country, this year we can also thank God for three local victories for the Sanctity of Human Life.

House Bill 2 and Senate Bill 5 have been passed by the Kentucky Legislature this month. Both protect the interests of the unborn. House Bill 2 requires physicians performing abortions to provide an ultrasound to patients prior to performing the abortion procedure. While a mother is not required to view the ultrasound or hear the heartbeat, it is now required for physicians to give her that option. Senate Bill 5 prevents abortions for children older than 20 weeks gestation.

Local Lexington news announced last Sunday that the abortion clinic on Burt Road is now permanently closed. This abortion facility has been the focus of several 40 Days for Life campaigns which Good Shepherd participated in. It has also been closed for several months because of a court injunction.

As we pray to end abortion in our nation, let us remember to thank God for these developments. It is good to thank elected officials, too!

## THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**WALK TO BETHLEHEM UPDATE :** This week, we walked another 60 miles, which now puts us a little past Madrid, Spain. *Muy bien!* Each new year, millions of people resolve to get in shape by exercising and adopting better nutrition habits. Our Walk to Bethlehem is one way to inspire folks to stay the course and keep those resolutions. It takes time, effort, and commitment to reach any worthwhile fitness goal. But remember: you can climb the highest of mountains if you do it a few steps at a time. As long as you keep putting one foot in front of the other, you will eventually get to your destination. So, 60 miles may not seem too far for us to have collectively walked last week, but it's better than 6 miles. And it puts us further to our goal: Bethlehem. Remember, Jesus is our coach.
