Attached are the summer reading selections and instructions for the 2025-26 school year for 11th and 12th grade students. Summer reading is required, as per the student handbook. Students who are taking a dual enrollment ENGLISH course in the FALL semester are the ONLY students who are not assigned summer reading.

Summer reading will amount to roughly one-third of the coursework for the first grading period of the school year. It is of the utmost importance that students take these reading assignments seriously.

Steps to take:

- ✓ Students are responsible for obtaining a copy of the assigned book and reading it before the first day of the 2025-26 school year.
- ✓ Keep a reading log. See instructions below. This will be submitted for grading ON THE FIRST FRIDAY OF SCHOOL (Friday, August 8th) (100 points)
- ✓ Be prepared to take an AR test within the first week of school (come to class with questions prior)
- ✓ Complete a project/essay within the first 1-2 weeks of school (100 points)

Summer Reading Log Instructions:

- Format: handwritten, legible journal entry log on loose leaf. Write your name, date, class, and the name of the book on the first page. Label and use a different sheet of loose leaf for each entry. You DO NOT need to skip lines, and you CAN write on the back of the pages.
- Procedure: Each book requires a minimum of one journal entry per chapter. If the book has more than 20 chapters, then a journal entry should be written for every 2 chapters. Write a two-paragraph long entry in the reading log (a paragraph is 5+ well-constructed, grade-level appropriate sentences). Entries should be dated.

Each entry should include:

- 1st paragraph- a summary of what you read (use facts and quotes from the novel)
- 2nd paragraph- a personal reflection or reaction to your reading.
 (Reflections can incorporate questions about what you don't understand, predictions about what you believe is going to happen in the future, emotions that you feel while reading, personal opinions about what you are reading, comments on the author's craftsmanship, vocabulary would you have looked up, and so on)

Notes:

- Students are welcome to consult helpful websites such as Sparknotes, Quizlet, Bookrags, etc.; however, the
 assessments given will ensure students have read the actual text. Students who do not read the text will not do
 well on the assessments.
- Copying from SparkNotes, another student, using AI, or any other form of copying/plagiarism will result in an automatic 0 on these graded assignments.
