

A Thought for the Fourth Sunday of Lent

Our gospel passage today from John 9:1-41 is about a man who was healed of blindness and who also eagerly told others what happened to him. Two things happen for the man: firstly, he is healed of physical blindness and secondly, he becomes a follower, a believer and as such he receives the gift of faith.

It might seem strange that the man who was transformed in today's gospel didn't really say anything until after he was healed. He doesn't ask Jesus for a cure nor did he tell his story of being relegated to begging in a world he had never seen. He was just there. No doubt he was the object of other people's judgement. When they saw him, they no doubt asked: Whose sin caused his blindness? Or, Whose fault was it? Or, Who should we blame? Isn't that what we do so often when we see the plight of others?

Jesus' response to such questions was: *It's no one's fault. No one is to blame*. It is an opportunity for God's works to show forth. It is an opportunity to love.

As our Lenten journey continues, let us pray for the grace to respond to the needs of others with love and to see them as opportunities to love and to extend God's love.


