

A Thought for the Fifth Sunday of Lent—Year A

Our scripture readings today present images of hope, promise and new life.

In our first reading from Ezekiel 37:12-14 we have an image, a vision, of new life in what seemed to be a hopeless situation. In our Gospel reading from John 11:1-45, we read about Lazarus being literally raised from the dead.


would like to participate in the procession to gather in the Gathering Space before Mass.




