

MONTH 2: (Weeks 4-7)

"I can jump!"



The baby is making progress and developing all its external features and internal organs. The brain is functioning at 40 days. Mom can hear the baby's heartbeat now on an ultrasonic stethoscope. Baby-teeth buds are present at 6 &1/2 weeks, and a two-month old baby can suck their thumb. Everything we need to survive after birth is already present by the end of the eighth week. 
