

Words of Wisdom

Luke 6:45 The good person out of the good treasure of the heart produces good, and the evil person out of evil treasure produces evil; for it is out of the abundance of the heart that the mouth speaks.

If what comes out of the abundance of your heart is what the mouth speaks, what is in your heart? When the name of God is upon your lips, is it to glorify Him or to disrespect Him? Are your words sincere words of love? Is what insist upon by way of your mouth, an insisting on your rights or upon God's rights? Yes, God has Divine rights that supersede all others.

Is your speech a powerful witness to what it means to follow THE Lord and Savior? Are your words purposeful?

Some of the most intimidating lines out of Sacred Scripture, to me, are Matthew 12:36 & 37; ³⁶ "I tell you, on the day of judgement men will render account for every careless word they utter"; 37 "for by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."

If we take this to prayer, it will not be long before we realize that it is not only what we say but when did we keep quiet? Should we have said something? Should we have spoke for the faith? Should we have discouraged sin? Should we have encouraged and helped heal someone who was wounded? Were we to verbalize forgiving those who trespass against us, as we hope to be forgiven our trespasses?





Saint Mary Magdalene:

St. Mary Magdalene is one of the greatest saints of the Bible and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace. The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but we do know she



was present with Christ during his public ministry, death and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels.

Mary Magdalene has long been regarded as a prostitute or sexually immoral in western Christianity, but this is not supported in the scriptures. It is believed she was a Jewish woman who lived among Gentiles, living as they did.

The Gospels agree that Mary was originally a great sinner. Jesus cast seven demons out of her when he met her. After this, she told several women she associated with and these women also became followers.

Despite the scholarly dispute over her background, what she did in her subsequent life, after meeting Jesus, is much more significant. She was certainly a sinner whom Jesus saved, giving us an example of how no person is beyond the saving grace of God.
