Tuesday, December 19th, there will be a special night of confessions! We will have two visiting priests in addition to the pastor available to help you. So, what should you remember for confession? What gets overlooked?

- Pray in advance of entering the confessional. Ask the Holy Spirit and your Guardian Angel to help you recall your sins.
- To the best of your ability confess ALL your mortal sins, if you choose to omit any, the whole confession is invalid. This is not the same accidentally missing some.
- When you enter the room, state how long it has been since your last confession (to the best of your recollection.) Your state in life (Widowed, separated, married, engaged, single etc.) this will help the priest to help you and have a context.
- List your mortal sins and how many times, as best you can. If you have been away from the sacrament for a long time, you can say something like, "I've had an ongoing problem with (language, sins against purity, gossip or whatever) for years and its nearly every day/whenever I get stressed..." or whatever.
- The priest rarely needs a story or a background. If there is a line of people waiting, just get in and say what you need to say. It is not therapy but the sacrament of reconciliation/penance. This is not your spouse's confession; you just give your own sins.
- Faithful priests are glad you are there. If you have been away for a while, the priest is usually doubly glad. We know, it takes courage to come back. Yet, I can tell you those who come regularly can often perceive great benefit of it.
- Yes, you need to at least WANT to do better. You cannot come in planning to continue in your mortal sins. You may think it is going to be difficult, but you plan on giving it your best. That and contrition are sufficient.
- Do not be embarrassed for forgetting the act of contrition. Confession can be a little intimidating until you get used to it. It is not a problem.
- Whatever you have done, the priest has heard it before. You are very unlikely to shock or startle him.

Praised be Christ Jesus, now and forever.



Peter Canisius SJ (Dutch: Pieter Kanis; 8 May 1521 – 21 December 1597) was a Dutch Jesuit priest. He became known for his strong support for the Catholic faith during the Protestant Reformation in Germany, Austria, Bohemia, Mor avia, Switzerland and the British Isles. The restoration of the Catholic Church in Germany after the Protestant Reformation is largely attributed to the work there of the Society of Jesus, which he led. He is venerated in the Catholic Church as a saint and as a Doctor of the Church.

Christmas Wafer Oplatki

Christmas wafer (Polish: opłatek, plural opłatki; Lithuanian: kalėdaitis, plural kalėdaičiai; Slovak: oblátka, plural *oblátky*) is a Catholic Christmas tradition celebrated in Poland,^[1] Lithuania, ^[1] Moravia,^[2] and Slovakia.^[3] The custom is traditionally observed during *Kūčios* in Lithuania and Wigilia in Poland on December 24^{th.}

The unleavened wafers are baked from pure wheat flour and water, are usually rectangular in shape^[4] and very thin; they are identical in composition to the altar bread that becomes the Eucharist at the consecration during Mass in the Roman Catholic Church. The Opłatki wafers are embossed with Christmas-related religious images, varying from the nativity scene, especially Virgin Mary with baby Jesus, to the Star of Bethlehem.
