A Little Refresher

We use some words pretty often in Church, that people just presume everyone knows. A little refresher from time to time can be helpful. Here are a few regularly used words: (All definitions taken from Catholic Bible Dictionary by Scott Hahn).

Messiah - The anointed one, the Redeemer who is spoken of by the prophets of the Old Testament whose mission is to bring salvation to Israel.

Redemption – The payment of a ransom price to liberate someone from captivity.

Sin – Defined by theologians as any thought word, or deed that transgresses the law of God. In the famous words of Saint Augustine, sin is "something said, done, or desired that is contrary to the eternal law".

Repentance – A conversion of heart away from sin and toward God. It begins with remorse for having offended God and entails both a change in one's life and a determination to avoid the further occasion of sin.

Hope – The confident expectation of some desired good. Hope entails personal volition, and we must act to bring about what is desired; hope understands what is desired will not necessarily be attained easily or readily.



Are you looking for a faith related challenge for 2024? Have you ever heard the term "Doctor of the Church?" It's a term for some of the Church's all star writers and preachers, less than 40 in 2000 years of the Church's existence. Their writings are considered the gold standard in Catholic teaching. Saint Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274), Italian Dominican, wrote systematically on philosophy, theology, and Catholic doctrine, patron of Catholic schools and education, one of the most influential theologians in the West [1568].

Saint Bonaventure (c. 1217-1274), Franciscan, bishop of Albano, Italy, cardinal.

Saint Isidore of Seville (c. 560-636), Spanish bishop, encyclopedist, and preeminent scholar of his day.

Saint Anselm of Canterbury (1033-1109), archbishop, called "Father of Scholatism" [1720].

Saint Peter Chrysologus (c. 400-450), archbishop of Ravenna, Italy, homilist and writer, counteracted Monophysite heresy [1729].

Saint Leo I, the Great (c. 400-461), pope, wrote christological and other works against the heresies of his day [1754].
